From the Pastor's Desk

This was an eventful week. On Friday before school started, the teachers, school administrators and pastoral staff had a nice morning of retreat together finishing with some quiet prayer before the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration in church. It's good to have the school back as being a direct mission of the parish in passing on the Catholic faith to the children. Teachers play such an important role in modeling and teaching what Jesus Christ has passed on to the Church. I think for all of us it was good to rest for a while in the Lord remembering that He is in charge, our task it to try and trust and follow.

The school reopening has been going well so far and the children and teachers are adapting heroically. One little preschool boy even showed how he brought his own hand sanitizer and could apply it himself. Dr. Hillmann, the administrators and all the teachers are doing a phenomenal job in adjusting to the combination of remote and in class learning and the IT personnel have been working very hard to get them laptops and Chrome books that they will need. It's a stressful but hopeful time and it is so good to see the kids back in school!

This past Sunday we added the 11am English and 1pm Spanish Mass with about 70 people attending each. Note that these Masses are in the regular schedule now so be sure to register through the new parish website. We will add the 7:30am Mass back in when the need arises, and we get more volunteers. If you would really like to have the 7:30am Mass come back sooner than later you can offer yourself as a volunteer to help greet, usher or sanitize since the concern right now isn't priest availability but having Covid volunteers...contact Jim Madura if you are able to volunteer.

If you had a memorial brick in the Mary Garden at St. Cornelius or in front of the church at St. Thecla and would like to replant it in the prayer garden at St. Elizabeth next to the rectory you can absolutely do that! There are plenty of spots available and I think the pavers are all the same size.

Now for a look at our readings. Right after saying that Peter was the rock of the Church that we heard in last week's Gospel it says today that He told the disciples ***"that He must go to Jerusalem suffer greatly...and be killed and on the third day be raised."*** Peter rebuked Jesus and responded in a way that we all might, ***"God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to You."*** To save this fallen world, Christ came to suffer and die for our sins. The cross comes before the resurrection. We naturally flee from suffering, but the Lord shows us how it is a path of atonement, of reconciling. Suffering can bring us to our knees and lead us back to God.

Jesus reminded Peter that he was not thinking as God does about suffering. The times we are going through are in many ways unprecedented, but God is only allowing the trials for some good to come from it and to purify the Church. We have all gotten a bit soft and perhaps taken the Church and Christ for granted, now is the time to reclaim our identity, to take up our crosses bravely and follow Christ as faithful Catholics. The only thing we take with us when we die is the person that we have become. As the Lord said it wouldn't profit us to gain the whole world and lose our souls in the process, ***"For the Son of Man will come with His angels in His Father's glory, and then He will repay all according to his conduct."***

Be at peace and keep the faith.

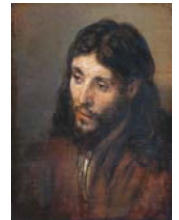
If you are currently using Give Central or LPI you will need to close those accounts - your giving through them DOES NOT automatically transfer to St. Elizabeth.

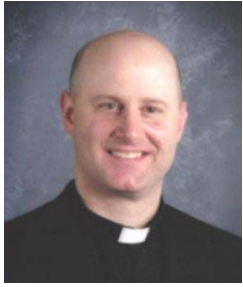

Fr. Michael Grisolano - Pastor of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish.

I was born and raised in Chicago Ridge, a southwest suburb of Chicago. My parents and three sisters and brother along with their families still live in the Chicagoland area. We all attended Our Lady of the Ridge Grade School and I went to Marist High School.

I then studied at the University of Illinois in Champaign/Urbana and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in History. I worked for four years after college before discerning a call to the priesthood.

I entered Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 2012.

As a priest I served as Associate Pastor at St. Julie Parish in Tinley Park from 2012-2015. I was also the Associate Pastor at St. Damian Parish in Oak Forest from 2015-2017.

I was named to be the Pastor of St. Tarcissus Parish in Chicago starting July 1, 2017. In 2020, I was so proud to be named the Pastor of the new St Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish.

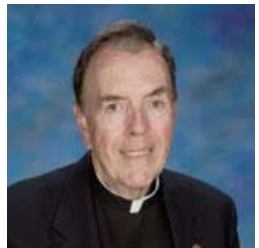
Fr. Lukas Ouda - Associate Pastor at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish.

I was born in Kenya. I am the third born of a big family of ten, four sisters and five brothers, and I presume because of that, I am a people person who loves Christ and His Church.

I came to the USA ten years ago and joined Loyola University in 2010. A year later, I went to Mundelein Seminary for four years and was ordained in 2015.

I was assigned to Blessed Sacrament Parish Chicago as Associate Pastor for two years and then served another two years as Chaplain at the University of Chicago Medicine and Associate Pastor at St. Stanislaus Bishop and Martyr Parish in Posen IL. I also served at St. Barbara Parish and St. Therese Parish before coming to St. Elizabeth.

I am looking forward to sharing that love of Christ with the parishioners of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish. May God bless you all. Amen.



Fr. Daniel McCarthy - Pastor Emeritus of St. Tarcissus

I was born in Chicago on July 1, 1941, and was raised by my Irish born parents on Chicago's South Side where I became the rarest of creatures: a South Side Cubs Fan!!

I was taught by the B.V.M. Sisters until third grade at Holy Cross Parish, then by the Sisters of Mercy at St. Joachim Parish. At the age of 14, two major events took place in my life: We moved from the Southeast Side to the Northwest Side because of a job transfer for my dad. Secondly, I began my studies for the priesthood at Quigley Preparatory Seminary.

After being assigned as a Deacon to Maryville Academy, Des Plaines, I was ordained a priest on April 27, 1967 by John Cardinal Cody. My first priestly assignment was to Angel Guardian Orphanage.

It was because of my time at Maryville and Angel Guardian that my love and appreciation for young people was fostered. That has continued to this day. In 1974, upon the closure of the Orphanage, I became Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Victory Parish.

In that time I also served for two years as Assistant Director of C.Y.O. for the Archdiocese. In 1981, I was transferred to St. Mathias Parish in Chicago's Lincoln Square neighborhood. Then in July 1983, Cardinal Bernardin appointed me as Pastor of St. Timothy Parish in West Rogers Park where I served until 1986.

In April of that year I returned to Our Lady of Victory as its Pastor. After serving 12 years, my term as Pastor expired.

I came to St. Tars as Associate Pastor in October, 1998. I became Pastor of St. Tarcissus in July of 2000 and held that position until I retired in 2011.

I am now also chaplain at Notre Dame & Resurrection High Schools and coordinate the altar server ministry here at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity.

**KNOW YOUR PARISH CHURCH -
SANCTUARY WINDOWS TO THE LEFT OF THE CRUCIFIX**

In the top window is a golden Chalice and Flower. The Flower represents the Garden of Gethsemani and the Chalice refers to our Lord's agony in that garden where He said: *"My soul is sad even unto death."* And going forward a little, He fell prostrate and prayed, saying, *"Father, if it is possible, let this chalice pass away from Me; yet not as I will, but as Thou willest."*

The Pitcher and Basin recall Jesus before Pilate with the crowd crying out: Let Him be crucified! *"Now Pilate seeing that he was doing no good, but rather that a riot was breaking out, took water and washed his hands in sight of the crowd, saying: I am innocent of the blood of this just Man. And all the people answered and said: His Blood be on us and on our children."*

The Cock refers to Peter's Denial. While Christ was on trial, Peter huddled outside in the courtyard. Three times he cursed and swore that he know not Christ. After his third protestation, Sacred Scripture relates: *"And at that moment a cock crowed a second time. And Peter remembered the word that Jesus had said to him: Before a cock crows twice, thou wilt deny Me three times. And he began to weep."*

The Whips and the Pillar tell of Christ's scourging. *"Now at the festival time the procurator used to release to the crowd a prisoner, whomever they would. Now he had at that time a notorious prisoner called Barabbas... The chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas and to destroy Jesus... Then he released to them Barabbas; but Jesus he had scourged."*

The Crown of Thorns refers to this added torture in the Passion: *"Then the soldiers of the procurator took Jesus into the Praetorium... And they put on Him a scarlet cloak; and weaving a crown of thorns, they put it upon His Head... And bending the knee before Him they mocked Him, saying: Hail, King of the Jews! And they spat on Him and took the reed and kept striking Him on the Head."*

The last window represents the Death of Christ. The three blue Nails symbolize the crucifixion. The placard with I.N.R.I. refers to the sign placed on the Cross. *"And Pilate also wrote an inscription and had it put on the Cross. And there was written: Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews... And it was written in Hebrew, in Greek, and in Latin."* I.N.R.I. are the first letters of the words of his inscription in Latin: Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum.

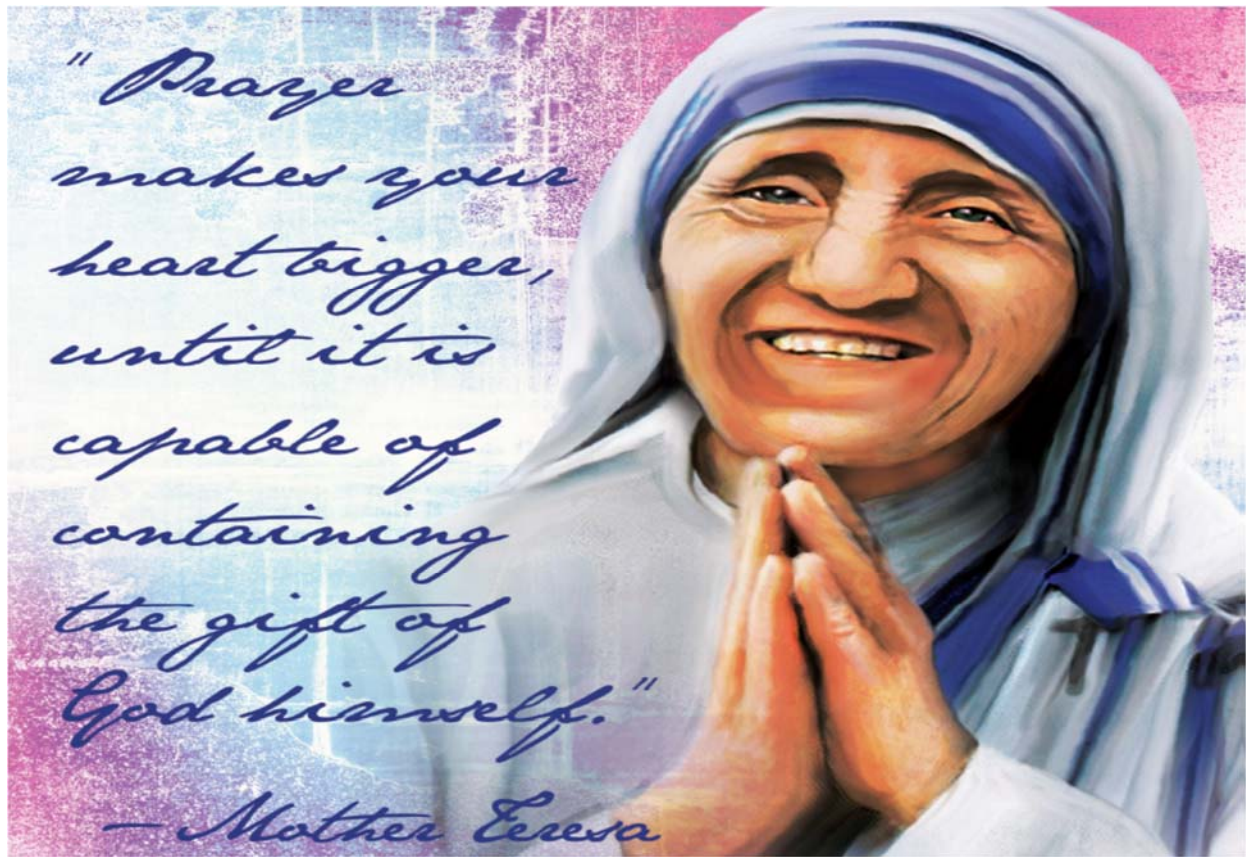
