From the Desk of the Pastor

We applied and were certified for Phase IA for reopening the church which means you can come into the church for private prayer but right now the time is between 11am and 2pm on Tuesdays. Depending on the number of volunteers this is what we thought was possible for now. By the time you read this we should have been certified by the Archdiocese for Phase II of reopening the church for public Masses which is great news. We will be allowed up to 20% capacity attendance. We will start with having two weekend Masses beginning on Saturday, June 20th. The Phase II Mass times will be on Saturday 5:00pm and Sunday at 9:00am. (This Mass will continue to be live streamed as well). Check the bulletin for how to register online, you can always call or email the office as well to register. If we have enough volunteers and desire from you, we will add a second Sunday Mass.

This Sunday is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. While we can't gather to have the same procession we've had in the last couple of years, I will do a simple Eucharistic procession through ten blocks of the neighborhood, you can check the cover of the bulletin for the exact route. We will have our future music and choir directors present for some beautiful accompaniment for the Lord, and our own Jim Madura leading with a cross. If you stand outside or in your doorway as we pass, I will give you a blessing with the Lord. Since you can't come this weekend to church to receive and honor Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, the Lord can come to you.

Hopefully, by the time you read this the diagonal parking project on Moody Ave will be completed and we will have nineteen total diagonal city spots right off our current parking lot for everyone's use. This is some progress on the parking front. Final engineering drafts are being made for the old convent to then be presented to the City for rezoning. I haven't signed a contract yet for the convent demolition but I expect it to happen before the winter.

The contracts for the schoolteachers were returned and a current faculty list in this bulletin. There are still some "specials" being worked on as well as preschool, but all the primary grades were filled with teachers from PFGA North or St. Thecla. Not all the teachers that you have known accepted a future job, so we wish them well in their futures. I am sure any teacher not returning would be grateful for a kind word or a prayer from you. The future principle, Dr. Kristine Hillmann will officially start on July 1st although she did assist Margaret Kinel in the hiring process. The school website is up with at least basic content and some stock photos, it will be updated soon.

We are blessed now to begin planning for our First Holy Communion which will take place on Saturday, June 27th at 1pm. We'll have a professional photographer and maybe will be able to livestream it as well for the family and parishioners who would like to be included, even though from a distance. The children have long been preparing and anticipating this moment to receive the Eucharist, please keep them and your families in your prayers.

Lastly, I know this has been a trying time for everyone, I try to keep you as informed as I can while in this awkward time of transition. There are no full-time parish staff yet but the cavalry is coming soon. The Lord is with us, keep the faith.

ST. TARCISSUS TO RE-OPEN FOR PUBLIC MASSES

We are planning to have Masses on Saturday, **June 20 at 5:00** and Sunday, **June 21 at 9:00** and Saturday, **June 27 at 5:00** and Sunday, **June 28 at 5:00**.

Attendance will be limited to 110 people at each Mass and online reservations are required. You can make them, by visiting here:

- Click the "Sign Up" box for the Mass you would like to reserve.
- Click the "Submit and Sign Up" button at the bottom of the screen. You will be automatically directed to the "Sign Me Up" page.
- On the "Sign Me Up" page, you have the option to submit a comment in the "My Comment" section. If you will be attending with other family members, please add their name(s) in the Comments box.
- Choose quantity. If only you are signing up, please choose (1). If others will be joining you (those listed in the comment section), please choose the total number of registrants, including yourself.
- Enter your Name and Phone Number (required) and email address (optional).
Click the "Sign Up Now" button to complete the process. A confirmation screen will then pop up with the details of your reservation.

If you do not have a computer you can call the rectory during regular business hours.

We need to do this, both to insure more people don't show up than we have room for and to have contact information in case it becomes necessary to do contact tracing.

Please note that there are several other points that you need to know about before you come to Mass and while you are here. Please see the next two pages for this information.

Some highlights:

- you must pre-register
- You must wear a face mask
- Use must social distance while in church (you will be seated by an usher, you will be directed at Communion time and you will be directed when it is time to leave.)
- A collection basket will not be passed. There will be a drop box near the baptismal font for your contributions.
- Communicants will have their hands sanitized be they receive. You will only receive in your hand.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE



Enter only in marked doorways.



Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter.



Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion.



Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE



Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church.



Stay home if you are ill.



Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear.



Remember to bring your registration if you are not already on a list of attendees.



Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor).



Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit.



Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

DURING THE SERVICE



Do not change seats during a service.



There will be no passing of offering baskets.



No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass.



Follow instructions for Communion:

- Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter.
- Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor.
- When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces.
- Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering.
- Extend a single hand to receive the Host.
- After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host.
- Replace your face covering or mask.
- Follow instructions to return to your pew.

AFTER THE SERVICE



Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you.



You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher.



Use only the designated exit doors.



Do not congregate outside the church doors.



Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.
