FROM THE PASTOR...

August 8, 2021

Over 75 people have responded with interest in a Thursday evening Mass in English preceded by Reconciliation. Right now, the two most popular times for the Mass are at either 6:00 p.m. or 7:00 p.m. so if you have a preference and haven't voted please do so.

Every Friday there are bilingual Confessions from 6:00 - 6:45 p.m., and the Rosary in Spanish at 7:00 p.m.. It is followed by Adoration. Starting in September there will be a Spanish Mass on the first Fridays of the month in place of the Adoration time. We are blessed that Bishop Bartosic will come periodically for that Mass as well as for our 1:00 p.m. Spanish Sunday Mass.

The Covid situation is ever changing and based on CDC and city and county guidelines, the Archdiocese is following their lead:

"Beginning now, it is strongly recommended that all persons entering Archdiocesan facilities be masked regardless of their vaccination status. This applies to parish offices, schools, churches and other public spaces... Further guidance on mask usage during liturgies will be forthcoming for clergy and lay ministers. We will release student and staff mask guidelines for the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year shortly."

Christ's words today to the murmuring Jews helps to remind us of truths we've talked about in the last two weeks in the Gospels. He said: ***"I am the Bread that came down from heaven...Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die."***

The Eucharist is the food for our journey to eternal life. The last Holy Communion we ever receive is called Viaticum. The word Viaticum means "for the journey" or "food for the journey." Christ becomes our food in that moment so that we don't die alone, but He accompanies us in our passage through death with the hope of eternal life. In a certain way, every Holy Communion is a Viaticum because we are all on a journey through this life to eternity and the Lord needs to sustain us on that journey.

We don't always feel great about the normal food we eat. Some meals are very enjoyable, tasteful, and consoling, but sometimes we just eat because we need the energy for the day. The Eucharist can be like that, too. Sometimes you may be feeling very consoled during Mass and sometimes you may feel like Elijah, discouraged or even despairing because of the difficulties of life, and God can handle that reality.

After the battle with the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel, Elijah had to flee for his life because King Ahaz and Jezebel were trying to kill him. Elijah said: ***"This is enough, O Lord! Take my life...but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat."*** Elijah tried to give up and sleep again and die but the angel came back again to order him to eat.

God knows our struggles and what we need to sustain us. That's why Jesus commands us to receive Him in the Eucharist, at least every Sunday, like the Lord repeatedly told Elijah: ***"Get up and eat, or else the journey will be too long for you."***


Sharing Families-Rwanda

Summer with the Saints: St. Gianna Beretta Molla

Born in Italy, Gianna was the tenth of thirteen children. She loved to ski and mountain climb and was an active member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Gianna was a diligent student when it came to her faith and her academic studies. She earned a degree in medicine and surgery, specializing in pediatrics and went on to open a clinic. It was through this clinic that she met Pietro Molla, who would become her husband.

While pregnant with her last child, doctors discovered a tumor. Gianna allowed them to remove the tumor but made it known that she did not want her baby to be harmed. In April 1962, Gianna had a beautiful baby girl named Gianna Emanuela. Unfortunately, Gianna had an infection after the birth of her daughter and she passed away at home the week after the birth of her daughter.

In 2004, St. John Paul II canonized Gianna Beretta Molla. Present were her husband and children making this the first time a husband witnessed the canonization of his wife. Their daughter Gianna Emanuela followed in her mother's footsteps and became a doctor herself.

St. Gianna Beretta Molla is the patron saint of mothers, physicians and unborn children.



The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist: Basic Questions and Answers – Part 1 of 8

Introduction

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church his Spouse a memorial of his death and resurrection. As the Gospel of Matthew tells us:

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." (Mt 26:26-28; cf. Mk 14:22-24, Lk 22:17-20, 1 Cor 11:23-25)

Recalling these words of Jesus, the Catholic Church professes that, in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: *"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. ...For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink"* (Jn 6:51-55). The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine—the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. This presence of Christ in the Eucharist is called "real" not to exclude other types of his presence as if they could not be understood as real (cf. Catechism, no. 1374). The risen Christ is present to his Church in many ways, but most especially through the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

What does it mean that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine? How does this happen? The presence of the risen Christ in the Eucharist is an inexhaustible mystery that the Church can never fully explain in words. We must remember that the triune God is the creator of all that exists and has the power to do more than we can possibly imagine. As St. Ambrose said: "If the word of the Lord Jesus is so powerful as to bring into existence things which were not, then a fortiori those things which already exist can be changed into something else" (De Sacramentis, IV, 5-16). God created the world in order to share his life with persons who are not God. This great plan of salvation reveals a wisdom that surpasses our understanding. But we are not left in ignorance: for out of his love for us, God reveals his truth to us in ways that we can understand through the gift of faith and the grace of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. We are thus enabled to understand at least in some measure what would otherwise remain unknown to us, though we can never completely comprehend the mystery of God.

As successors of the Apostles and teachers of the Church, the bishops have the duty to hand on what God has revealed to us and to encourage all members of the Church to deepen their understanding of the mystery and gift of the Eucharist. In order to foster such a deepening of faith, we have prepared this text to respond to fifteen questions that commonly arise with regard to the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We offer this text to pastors and religious educators to assist them in their teaching responsibilities. We recognize that some of these questions involve rather complex theological ideas. It is our hope, however, that study and discussion of the text will aid many of the Catholic faithful in our country to enrich their understanding of this mystery of the faith.
