FROM THE PASTOR...

The owners of the former Produce Center are now leasing their property and your car might get towed if you park there! I know many of you have been accustomed to parking at the Produce Center lot to go to Mass in the past but be aware that the owners have warned us that they will begin towing vehicles not doing business with their new, temporary tenants.

After my Masses this weekend, I have the blessing of attending my second week of the Institute for Priestly Formation Spiritual Direction Training Program with may annual priest retreat extending that time. I won't be at the parish from October 4th through the 13th. Please pray for me and be assured of my prayers for all of you and for our growth as a community of faith here at St. Elizabeth.

The Archdiocese has all active priests participate in a review process approximately every five years. "Catholic Leadership 360" is the name of the online tool that is used to assist priests to study and develop their leadership potential. It's providential that I should be asked to do this with many other priests in the context of Renew My Church. I will receive different levels of feedback from the bishop, staff, parish, and finance and parish council, etc...over the next few weeks.

There is a letter from Bishop Bartosic on page five of this bulletin and on the parish website that has the link for you to complete the parish survey. The goal of this process is to help priests of the Archdiocese grow. So please give constructive, but candid feedback. I really do appreciate your perspective and you should know that this process is completely anonymous...like the seal of confession! There will be multiple review sessions to help me make good use of the feedback after it has been received.

We have just entered the month of October which among other things is the month of the rosary. Every Friday this month I will lead the school students in the rosary and I encourage you and your families to pray the rosary individually or ideally as a family. The Respect Life group is hosting a movie night in the auditorium, *Pray*, about the life of Fr. Pat Peyton, the famous rosary priest who coined the term "the family that prays together, stays together." The showing will be on Friday, October 22nd at 6:00 p.m. in the auditorium with light refreshments served. The movie is about 70 minutes long...come join us!

This is also Respect Life Sunday and marks the beginning of Respect Life Month. The U.S. Bishops have designated this as a time when we come together to remember and pray for the legal protection of the unborn and an end to euthanasia. While there are many threats in this world to the sanctity of each human life, can any of them compare with the scope and evil of abortion? Abortion destroys more than the life of the child but deeply wounds the mother as well. We condemn no one, but must stand firm against evil for the good of the child, the mother, and all of society.

You can join the Rosary Coast to Coast on Sunday, October 10th at 3:00 p.m. in Caldwell Woods (see map on the next page) along with Catholics throughout the country. May the intercession

of the Blessed Mother protect our country and lead us all to a deeper conversion of heart to Christ her Son.

Great News!

I'm very happy to let all our parishioners know that another beautiful part of our Mass experience at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity will soon return. Beginning next weekend, Altar Servers will be back!

Many have asked about them. Many have missed all that they add to our liturgies. Because of Covid, we have been without Altar Servers for 19 months! While still taking all health precautions, we will now be able to pray more effectively with the presence of

our good Servers.

Because of Covid, we have been unable to train new Servers for two years. Meanwhile, many of our Servers have graduated and completed their commitment to altar serving. As a result, for the first few weeks we will have only two Servers at each Mass. We currently have just 22 Servers with none younger than 8th grade. Three of those Servers will not begin to serve just yet for a variety of reasons. This reduces our present group to 19. We will quickly begin to rebuild our Server group with new 6th, 7th, & 8th grade Servers this fall. Next spring we'll add 5th grade Servers.

For now, we can only say thanks to our 11 high school Servers and 11 8th grade Servers. Their generosity speaks volumes for them. Please keep them, and our future Servers in prayer.

Your pastor, Fr. Michael Grisolano, will soon be participating in the Catholic Leadership 360 Review process. This review process is part of the ordinary structure required by Archdiocesan Policy of every diocesan priest approximately every five years. It is an opportunity for Fr. Grisolano to recognize his talents and to grow to become a better priest and pastoral minister. Selected members of the parish staff and parish leadership, your Dean, and myself will be asked to be reviewers using this instrument.

According to Archdiocesan policies lay leadership and parishioners are to be given the opportunity to recognize Fr. Grisolano's gifts and to share their sentiments about his ministry. So, we are providing a parish-wide survey as part of his review process. The survey can be easily accessed by going to the Archdiocese's web page (https://www.archchicago.org/) and clicking on Offices and Ministries on the top panel. This will bring you to an alphabetical listing of offices. Under 'M', select Ministerial Resources for Parishes. You will then be directed to the Ministerial Resources for Parishes webpage. In the middle of the page, you will find "Parish-wide survey review for priests". The survey is available in English, Spanish, and Polish. Please click on the word 'Link' next to your appropriate language to access the survey.

If you have any concerns or comments pertaining to Father's review, feel free to contact me directly. If you have any further questions or suggestions about the review process you may contact Fr. Bob Heidenreich, Coordinator of Ministerial Review and Priests Programs, by email (rheidenreich@archchicago.org) or by phone at the Priests' Placement Office (312-534-5237).

When the Catholic Leadership 360 Review process has been completed Fr. Grisolano will be asked to share the insights he has received and his further developmental plans with you in the parish bulletin and on the parish web site.





The Holy Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and presents a wonderful opportunity to share this beautiful prayer with our children and students. Many people find it hard to adapt the Rosary to children. Here are some tips from the book 77 Ways to Pray with Your Kids:

- 1. Skip the beads, or get kid-friendly ones. If you're praying with children too young to follow direction, say the rosary without the aid of rosary beads. (Very young children may end up whipping them around.) When your kids are old enough, purchase a durable, kid-friendly rosary, such as a cord rosary.
- Start with one decade. Praying one decade of the rosary should take a little longer than five minutes. Be sure to introduce the mystery in advance; meditate on a different mystery each time, so that you eventually work your way through all the mysteries.
- 3.Get older kids and teens to lead. Research shows that the more agency we give kids around religious practices, the more likely they are to retain and integrate those practices into adulthood. Letting kids lead prayer is always a good idea, with appropriate support and guidance, so don't hesitate to let kids lead the rosary with the help of an appropriate resource. You might begin while they're younger by inviting them to offer their own intentions




