FROM THE PASTOR...

May 8, 2022

The 4th Sunday of Easter remembers Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd. In the brief but powerful Gospel we hear the Lord tell us: ***“My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish.”*** The voice of Christ speaks to us in many ways; through His Church, the Scriptures and Tradition, the lives of saints, in the depths of our conscience, through our prayer and even through those who love us.

Pope Francis has declared this Good Shepherd Sunday to be a special World Day of Prayer for Vocations, particularly for vocations to Holy Orders and the consecrated life of men and women religious. We pray that the Lord of the harvest will send out laborers for the sake of the kingdom. We all desire deep down to give ourselves in some heroic gift of love, whether through marriage and family life, or celibately for the sake of the kingdom of God. The world longs for and needs our witness.

The greatest gift parents can give to their children is a loving, faithful marriage and the reminder to the child that God has a particular vocation for them. Do you remind your child that Jesus has a plan for them, that He loves them and is calling them to holiness in some particular way? Most priests report that at some point in their lives, they were told that they might make a good priest one day and should consider it. I was voted most likely to be a priest in 8th grade even though I forgot it until many years later. I was not able to hear the call yet, but God was still calling...I finally heard.

The Lord speaks to us through the deepest holy desires of our hearts but often those who know us best can see something good in ourselves that we are blind to, and God speaks through them also. Can we as priests, parents, grandparents, and loving adults help children and young people through our prayers and encouragement discern their vocation?

This 4th Sunday of Easter is also Mother's Day, may all our mothers be blessed for all they have and continue to do for us.

You will notice flower sales in the vestibule after most of the Masses today. The funds go to support the good work of the Women's Center of Greater Chicagoland. The Women's Center has qualified staff and volunteers who counsel women that are strongly considering having an abortion. They offer counseling, free ultra-sounds, adoption referrals, material assistance, financial and social service referrals along with the prayers of Catholics through Eucharistic Adoration and Mass in their St. Jude Chapel. For over 35 years the Women's Centers around Chicago have saved the lives of over 40,000 babies *and* their mothers. I personally know the staff there and the good work that they do: <https://gotwc.org/about-us/>.

This weekend we also have a second collection that supports Catholic Charities. Our mothers have supported us throughout our lives, can we support mothers who are in need? Mothers and children are the largest group that Catholic Charities assists from counseling for pregnant mothers, to housing for families facing homelessness and domestic abuse, to care for aging mothers and grandmothers and more: www.catholiccharities.net.

In these times, local mothers and families really need assistance, please help the Women's Center and Catholic Charities as best you can. May God bless you for your generosity.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Sheep get an awfully bad rap, linguistically. Some are quick to label people as “sheep” if we think they haven’t sufficiently questioned authority or if they’re too willing to go along with someone else’s plan. We say someone has “the wool over their eyes” if they aren’t willing to see what we think is very obvious. “A wolf in sheep’s clothing” is what we call someone looking to take advantage of those too gullible to identify a real threat.

Taking all this into account and considering how often we are referred to as sheep in Scripture, you’ve really got to wonder if God trying to tell us something about ourselves.

If you look at the phraseology associated with sheep, it’s no wonder that nobody wants to be one. Sheep are innocent. Sheep can’t protect themselves. They’re vulnerable and easily misled.

We want to see ourselves as the opposite of all that. We like to think we’re shrewd, with plenty of common sense. We want to believe that we don’t have to rely on anybody for anything. We would sooner identify with the wolf than with the sheep — at least the wolf can take care of himself.

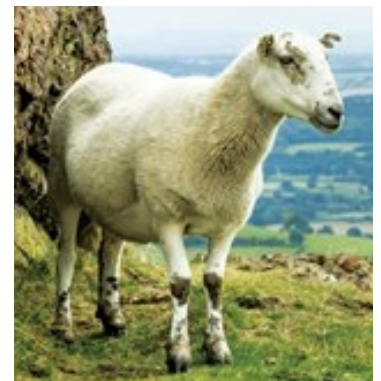
We do this because we often resist the need to rest in the greatness of God. Like a child walking to school alone for the first time (forgetting his mom is following watchfully in the car), we want to think we can handle it all by ourselves.

The truth is that God is trying to tell us something by comparing us to sheep: You don’t have to do this on your own.

Every time I look at an obstacle and think that there is no way around it, I am forgetting that I have a shepherd who knows the location of the gate.


