

FROM THE PASTOR...

June 26, 2022

Virtually everything is complete with the new parking lot, except for a few custom sized fence pieces...praise God! The trees and bushes look nice and will look even better in a few years as they mature. I will bless the parking lot on June 26th at 5:00 p.m. as part of the Totus Tuus kickoff with its missionaries. While there is no specific patron saint of parking lots, Mother Cabrini is often invoked in the aid of finding a parking spot. Here's a prayer that may come in handy when you're in need of a quick parking space, not that anyone will be running late to Mass; "*Holy Souls, Holy Saints, help me find an empty space.*"

Hopefully you can say a farewell to Fr. Chris Landfried since this is his last week. We'll have Pot Belly sandwiches and snacks after the 1:00 p.m. Mass in the Auditorium today. Our new Associate Pastor, Fr. Leo Sepulveda has already started to move in and will start officially on Friday, July 1^{st.} We're blessed to have him here. All the priests will have the chance this coming week to pray and visit together at the triennial priest convocation. Please say a prayer for the priests and bishops of the Archdiocese that we might work together and grow in holiness and fidelity to all that Christ teaches.

In today's Gospel we heard different sets of challenging words from Jesus about the costs of discipleship. The Gospel says: "As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, I will follow you wherever you go." This is a very bold statement; we know that when the disciples said things like this that they didn't really know what they were saying yet. The Lord told this bold "someone" an important truth about discipleship, He said; "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest His head."

This can be very hard to accept because we often want security in the here and now. I remember when my parents sold the family home. The first day I found out they were selling I was upset and was trying to talk them out of it. Especially as a priest who will probably never own property or my own "home" and must move from parish to parish, it was always nice to know I could go back to the home I had always known. My being upset only lasted a day and I've come to see that my family is what makes the home, even as it decreases in size due to death. I came to accept the painful truth that here, we have no lasting city, we seek a final homeland that is yet to come. This is true of parish homes, as well they can die, but like our families, they were given to us by God to help us get to our eternal home.

We also heard, "I will follow you Lord but first let me say farewell to my family at home." The person wants something to come "first" before following Jesus. He is hesitating in his commitment to follow Christ and the Lord responds by saying: "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." Perhaps a more modern example of this would be driving instead of plowing. If you're going to drive a car you need to look where you're going. Or if you keep looking in the rearview mirror you might get into an accident and certainly won't arrive at your destination. A person who texts, does makeup, or drinks and drives is not fit to be on the road.

These exchanges with Jesus and at least His partially committed followers show us that even good things like a house and home, and family obligations are good but need to be subordinated to our fol-

lowing of Christ. If we're looking to do God's will we'll find a way to do it, if we're looking for excuses, we'll find those too. Or as my father used to say: *"If it's important enough to you, it'll get done."*

Is there some attachment, relationship, or behavior in our lives that's not fit for the kingdom of God?

FR. CHRISTOPHER LANDFRIED FAREWELL RECEPTION





Weekday Masses June 28 - 30, 2022

Priests serving in the Archdiocese of Chicago will gather for their triennial convocation from June 27 through June 30. This gathering is an important and necessary time of spiritual renewal for the priests, so that they can better serve the People of God.

The priests have been asked to clear their schedules, so that they can fully participate in this experience. Consequently, during those four days, there might not be weekday Masses celebrated in some parishes. However, there will be prayer services to be determined by each parish. In cases of emergency, parishioners can contact parish staff who will make whatever referral is appropriate.

The people of the Archdiocese can support their priests in several ways. Their patient understanding of scheduling changes is very important. Even more important is the prayerful support they extend to priests who have prayed for them and with them. 
