

## FROM THE PASTOR...

This Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. While ordinarily a holy day of obligation, in 1991, the U.S. Bishops Conference modified the requirement as follows:

"Whenever January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated." (usccb.org).

We will still have an evening Mass that day at 6:30 p.m. because it is still a Holy Day, even if not obligatory this year. Also, that morning at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we will have all our parish and school staff in attendance, beginning a morning of reflection for us all as we prepare for another school year. Feel free to join us at that Assumption Mass and pray for all the staff so that we may better put Christ at the center of our lives in imitation of Mary. The parish office will be closed until 1:00 p.m. on August 15<sup>th</sup> and then we'll return to our normal hours of 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., M-F, and 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. on Saturdays.

We have a new Coordinator of Religious Education (CRE) in Peggy Bradley! Peggy is retiring from her career and has been asking the Lord how she can best serve Him next, and this position became available. Peggy was a long-time parishioner at St. Cornelius, was on the parish unification committee as part of RMC, taught as an 8<sup>th</sup> grade catechist here, and she brings a tremendous faith and energy to this role! We are all blessed. She doesn't have her parish/Arch email yet, so if you need to sign up your child for religious education this year and save \$25 with the 'early bird' discount through Monday, August 15, email Ashley Guinn: aguinn@archchicago.org.

We are trying to make the weekly "Presider Schedule" listing in the bulletin more informative to include not only the priest that is the main celebrant but also who is preaching and if there is a choir singing at the Mass. We have a missionary preacher coming the weekend of August  $27^{th}/28^{th}$  for example who will preach at all the Masses. Good news, the volunteer Guitar Ensemble will be starting back up playing and singing at about one Mass per month, usually the  $2^{nd}$  Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass. 
And now a look at today's Gospel. In His Sermon on the Mount the Lord tells us: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." Christ Himself is called the Prince of Peace. And our Lord once said that He would give us the peace that the world can't give. So, what are we to make of His words today: "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided..." How can Christ give peace and yet bring division at the same time, even division in family?

Not everyone is at the same place on their journey of faith, Jesus is warning us that once we are more committed to Him, those that aren't ready themselves will be resistant to that conversion

and possibly resentful. The constant pull toward worldliness is strong. In our fumbling attempts toward holiness and virtue, our family members might also be the first ones to remind us of our past sins and daily faults. Most of us will not have to suffer physical violence for the Lord, but there is always a price to pay for trying to witness to the Catholic faith. The biggest cross might be at home.






## WELCOME PEGGY BRADLEY – COORDINATOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (CRE)

One door closes and God opens another! I have the good fortune of being able to retire after a 40-year career in banking & investments. For months, my husband, John, has been asking me when I was finally going to retire and what my plans would be for retirement. My response was always: "I don't know ... I'd like to get more involved in the parish when I finally do decide to retire." And then came the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (don't worry if your internal spiritual clock is not automatically set to the rhythm of the Liturgical Calendar - we have a Faith Formation program to help with that!).

Luke's Gospel on July 17<sup>th</sup> was about Jesus' visit to the house of Mary and Martha. Mary remained seated at the feet of Jesus, listening intently to the words of Our Savior, while Martha was busily working as the "hostess with the mostess" to serve their honored guest. When Martha asks Jesus to tell Mary to help her with the chores, Jesus' response spoke to me: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. *Mary has chosen the better part*." And then a week later, Father Mike called, inviting me to step up to the role of Coordinator of Religious Education. And I knew this was the opportunity to choose "the better part"; to leave the corporate world and spend more time being present with the Lord, doing His work.

I have had the privilege of preparing middle schoolers for the Sacrament of Confirmation for nearly ten years; first at St. Cornelius, and more recently at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity. 


