

## FROM THE PASTOR...

In the First Reading today we are told "conduct your affairs with humility" and Our Lord tells us in the Gospel after the parable of the wedding table: "whoever exalts himself will be humbled but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." We find humble people so likable; easy going, not self-preoccupied. Yet we can all struggle with this virtue that is foundational in the spiritual life.

The root word of humility is *humus* which literally means "earth." So, being without an inflated opinion of ourselves, with our feet firmly on the ground, seeing things the way they are...that's humility. Most saints will put it even more simply and say: "*Humility is nothing but recognizing the truth*." God is God and we are not.

At first glance, the parable the Lord told us today seems to offer us a false humility as our ideal. Why not be honest, since humility is truth, and takes the place that we think we deserve? Because we have the temptation to see ourselves as better than others when we may not be. We can think too highly of ourselves and too poorly of others. To counteract this tendency to compare ourselves to others thinking we are holier, smarter, kinder, wiser etc., the Lord tells us to think better of others. If our judgment is wrong the Lord who knows and judges all will put everything in its proper place.

In Dante's Divine comedy the people who were proud on earth in purgatory were depicted as having large stones on their backs as a penance. The large stones forced them to move slowly and pressed them closer to the ground...bringing them back down to earth, humbling them. God doesn't wait until the next life to give us humbling moments.

There is a story that Hall of Fame baseball player Cal Ripken Jr. shares. He broke the Iron Man record for consecutive games played in baseball originally set by Lou Gehrig. After he retired, he still loved baseball and coached at baseball camps. Well one day a ten year old boy asked him: "Did you ever play baseball?" He didn't get angry but just said: "Yeah, I used to play baseball." The child didn't know about his fame and achievements...and his question helped even to put the value of those things into perspective for Cal Ripken who himself never liked the limelight.

Here is the Litany of Humility, so that we can all ask the Lord to help us to grow in this virtue:

O Jesus! meek and humble of heart, Hear me.

From the desire of being esteemed, Deliver me, Jesus (repeat after each line).

From the desire of being loved, From the desire of being extolled,

From the desire of being honored, From the desire of being praised,

From the desire of being preferred to others,

The desire of being preferred to others,

From the desire of being consulted,

From the desire of being approved,

From the fear of being humiliated,

From the fear of being despised,

From the fear of suffering rebukes,

From the fear of being calumniated,

From the fear of being forgotten,

From the fear of being ridiculed,

From the fear of being wronged,

From the fear of being suspected,

That others may be loved more than I,

Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it. (repeat after each line).

That others may be esteemed more than I,

That, in the opinion of the world, others may increase and I may decrease.

That others may be chosen and I set aside,

That others may be praised and I unnoticed,

That others may be preferred to me in everything,

That others may become holier than I, provided that I may become as holy as I should.

#### **Listening With An Open Heart**



At his weekly audience on January 31, 2018 Pope Francis spoke about the importance of the Liturgy of the Word at Mass, and the resulting importance of having lectors who can proclaim the readings well.

"We must look for good readers...Good readers and psalmists understand what they are reading and can convey it well,... they need to be prepared by reading over the text before Mass."

When someone reads well, not "distorting the words," this helps to create "a climate of receptive silence," he said, which is important, because "it is not enough to hear with the ears, without receiving in the heart the seed of the divine Word, allowing it to bear fruit."

On this note, Francis emphasized that it is also important that we are staying focused and listening to the readings with an open heart, not looking around at different things or making chit-chat.

"When they read the words of the Bible – the first reading, the second, the responsorial psalm, the Gospel – we must listen and open our heart," he said. "Because it is God himself who speaks to us. Do not think about other things or talk about other things."

Liturgically, when the same readings are proclaimed in each church, it is a way of fostering "ecclesial communion." he said.

Every part of the Mass is significant, including the Liturgy of the Word, which is when "God speaks, and we listen to him, and then put into practice what we have heard."

And "we need to listen to him!" he emphasized. "It is in fact a matter of life," just as it says in the Gospel of Matthew: "one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."

Just like in the Parable of the Sower, where we hear about the different results of the seeds that falls on different terrain, "the action of the Spirit, which makes the response effective, needs hearts that allow themselves to be worked and cultivated, so that what is heard at Mass passes into daily life," he said.

In fact, we must listen to the admonition of James the Apostle, the Pope continued, who tells us to "be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves."

Francis explained that the Word of God, especially as we hear it at Mass, is important nourishment for our daily lives. "How could we face our earthly pilgrimage, with its labors and its trials, without being regularly nourished and enlightened by the Word of God that resounds in the liturgy?" he asked.


