FROM FR. MIKE

While school has begun with just over 200 children enrolled, Religious Education (RE) starts this weekend. Please pray for all the children, their families, and the catechists, that this year brings them closer together in love as families and in the Lord. Please remind anyone you know that needs to register their child for the program as well.



This Sunday is also September 11th, the 21st anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center that killed nearly 3,000 people. In October of that year, the United States Congress passed a joint resolution designating that every September 11th be observed as "Patriot Day." The resolution requests that U.S. government entities and others display the flag of the United States at half-staff on Patriot Day and that the people of the United States observe a moment of silence in honor of the individuals who lost their lives as a result of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. As Catholics, we can pray for the repose of their souls as well.

In 2011, a presidential proclamation declared that Patriot Day is also a "National Day of Service." The proclamation calls on Americans to "participate in community service in honor of those our Nation lost, to observe this day with other ceremonies and activities, including remembrance services ... to honor the innocent victims who perished as a result of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001." This tragedy, which many of us remember, had the effect of bringing many people to their knees in prayer before God and a keener awareness about the things that matter most in life. May we support one another in prayer and in service, which should be even easier for us as disciples of Christ.

All our readings today put on display God's great mercy towards us. St. Paul says this quite simply: "This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Of these I am the foremost...but I was mercifully treated." Oddly enough, God's unconditional love and mercy pose some challenges for us in the spiritual life, which is on display at the beginning of the Gospel today.

The Pharisees were scandalized by Jesus' gracious treatment of tax collectors and other sinners. They seem to want to identify people with their sin while Christ wants to set us free. This is a danger for us all in the spiritual life, that we want to highlight other's sins not so that they can receive mercy, but condemnation. We can become agents of condemnation and not of forgiveness.

Jesus told the parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son to address this attitude. In these parables the word joy is used repeatedly when something was found that was lost: "My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." God doesn't rejoice in the death of the sinner, and He doesn't want us to.

"Every saint has a past; every sinner has a future." The Pharisees seem to see other people as lost and hopeless sinners, without a possible future in God. We must all guard against this attitude.

There is another danger in the spiritual life related to God's mercy that is also prevalent in our time. We can downplay our own brokenness and sin to the point that we don't think we need a Savior. This is a classically dysfunctional way of solving a problem...by pretending that there is no problem. We call this avoidance. In times past, perhaps many Catholics saw sin everywhere and condemned the sinner with the sin. One can also be deceived into believing "since God loves me unconditionally, I'm not really a sinner in need of mercy."

Whether we are prone to being scrupulous or lax in conscience, Jesus calls us to daily turn to the Father who consoles and disciplines us lovingly as we need. "I will rise and go to my Father."





In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that the shepherd rejoices when he finds one lost sheep. This story shows us that nothing and no one is insignificant to God who is compassionate and loving to all.


New Ministers of Care Training


The five week training for new Ministers of Care will begin Wednesday, September 28th at St. Benedict Village, Nursing and Rehabilitation in Niles.


