FROM THE PASTOR...

September 4, 2022

We are blessed to have our three Wichita seminarians returning this year: Matthew Cooke (3rd Theology), Miles Swigart (3rd Theology), and Grant Huslig (2nd Theology). You will get to hear them tell their stories and the year's updates on the weekend of September 17th, the Seminary Appeal weekend. We haven't finalized the ministries that they will be helping with, but they will likely be involved with teaching the children through the RE program. Please pray for our seminarians and that more young men and women are open to a vocation in the direct service of Christ in the Church. Let us know also if you would be interested in being an assistant catechist, there is one opening still for a support role in the classroom.

Perhaps this weekend we can attempt a little Ignatian imaginative contemplation with the Gospel. We are continuing with the Gospel of Luke and by Chapter 14, Jesus has done quite a bit of amazing things: He has raised two people from the dead (Jairus' daughter and the widow of Nain's son), He has calmed a storm, cast out demons, forgiven public sinners, healed many people, and gave beautiful teachings through parables like the Good Samaritan. The Lord's public ministry has obviously drawn much attention, but then Jesus Christ's preaching focuses on our response to such goodness and truth.

Today's Gospel begins by saying that great crowds were following Jesus. He addresses this next teaching not to the Twelve or to an elite few, but to all people who have seen His mighty deeds, by encouraging words, and the power of God in very real ways. If we were there, we might have known one of the people Jesus healed of leprosy, sickness, or even the people he raised from the dead. Let us imagine ourselves then as being in the great crowd when Jesus says:

"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple."

In our modern times we often approach evangelization in a sort of embarrassed, sheepish, almost apologetic way; "Can you give God just an hour on a Sunday?" "Can we just pray a few minutes every day?" But the Son of God is not ashamed of who He is and since He gives us all of the love, grace, and forgiveness we could ever need or hope for, He calls for an absolute response on our part.

Just a note about "hating" our parents, siblings, spouse, children, etc... Most commentaries say that it was a Hebrew idiom in Jesus' time. Hating something in this context would mean "loving it less" than something else. So, Christ tells us to love our family, possessions, entertainment, and comfort "less" than we love Him...if we don't He says we're not really His disciples, we're not really following Him. People or things aren't bad, but we must love them for what they are and not make them the absolute center of our lives.

In the final analysis, our growth in love and holiness is the goal and only by believing in and following Jesus Christ do we have any hope of salvation. If any secondary good thing gets in the way of our ultimate purpose, it has become an evil in a sense that we should "hate". The same Jesus who loved Peter and called him to be the first pope, called him Satan and an obstacle because Peter wanted to stop Jesus from the path of redemption, the cross. The Lord wants our ultimate good, nothing temporary or secondary will do. He is love and goodness itself, so He demands everything.

Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Thank you to the fabulous volunteers and donors who keep our food pantry stocked and running smoothly. The team consists of folks who stock the shelves, prepare fresh bread that is delivered weekly, and those who welcome our patrons on Tuesday mornings. We have a constant stream of donations through the box in the back of church and the shed that is available 24/7 next to the gym entrance (on Moody).



FOOD PANTRY

We are looking for volunteers to shop regularly for the St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Food Pantry. In addition to the food donations that we receive, we supplement our food pantry with purchased items. There are items that our patrons regularly seek such as rice, coffee, and other non-perishables. We also offer perishable items of milk and eggs on alternating weeks. Volunteers would be given a shopping list of items to purchase at stores such as Aldi and Dollar Tree. The non-perishable items may be shopped and delivered at any time utilizing the shed as a drop off. Perishable items are best bought on Sunday or Monday for distribution on Tuesday. Shopping and drop-off times for those items will be coordinated in order to get them into the refrigerators in a timely fashion.

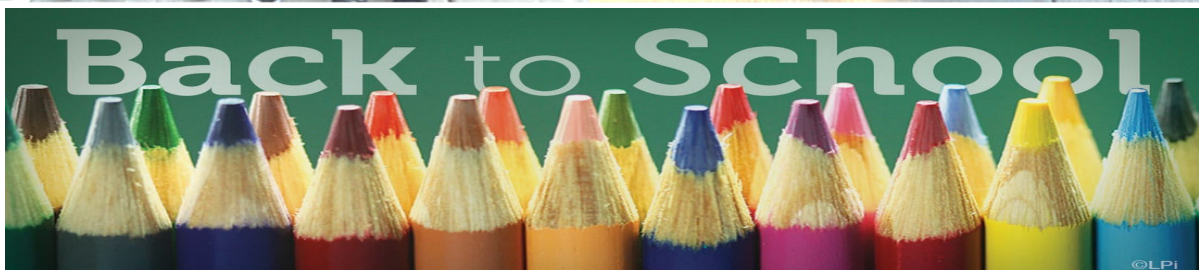

RESPECT



Definition: It is to speak and act in ways that value the dignity and worth of each person and all of creation.

Our Saint: St Francis of Assisi

St. Francis of Assisi was an Italian friar who lived in Italy in the 13th century. He lived a life of ascetic poverty and was dedicated to Christian charity. St. Francis was born to a wealthy cloth merchant. In his twenties, he took part in a war and was held prisoner for nearly a year. Shortly thereafter he had several experiences that shaped his conversion, and he renounced his worldly goods and family ties to embrace a life of poverty. One of these experiences was meeting and begging alms with the poor outside of St. Peter's in Rome and coming to see Christ in them. Another was meeting a leper while riding a horse in the countryside. Rather than ignoring or avoiding the leper, which would have been his reaction before the war, Francis showed love and respect for this leper as he embraced the man. St. Francis had a profound encounter with Christ in his meeting with this man, and he would go on to spend his time nursing lepers in Assisi. St. Francis is also known for his care and respect for animals and creation which is why his feast is frequently accompanied by a blessing of pets.



Join us in prayer:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:

where there is hatred, let me sow love;

where there is injury, pardon;

where there is doubt, faith;

where there is despair, hope;

where there is darkness, light;

where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek

to be consoled as to console,

to be understood as to understand,

to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive,

it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,

and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

How to live it:

- As we reflect on this prayer this month, focus on how you and your family can show respect for each other by bringing peace instead of conflict, pardon instead of injury, love and patience instead of anger and frustrations whenever there are difficulties.
- In honor of St. Francis' treatment of the leper he met consider the following:
 - If we encounter someone experiencing poverty, do we acknowledge them and treat them with dignity?
 - Do we think of the small ways that we show respect for the strangers we meet on the street, or do we thank the cashier at the store even if we are frustrated?
 - Do we as adults remember to always show the respect to the children in our lives that we want them to show to us?

Let us all ask God to help us with these things as we continue to grow in the virtue of respect this month.

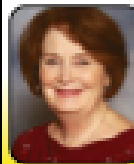
