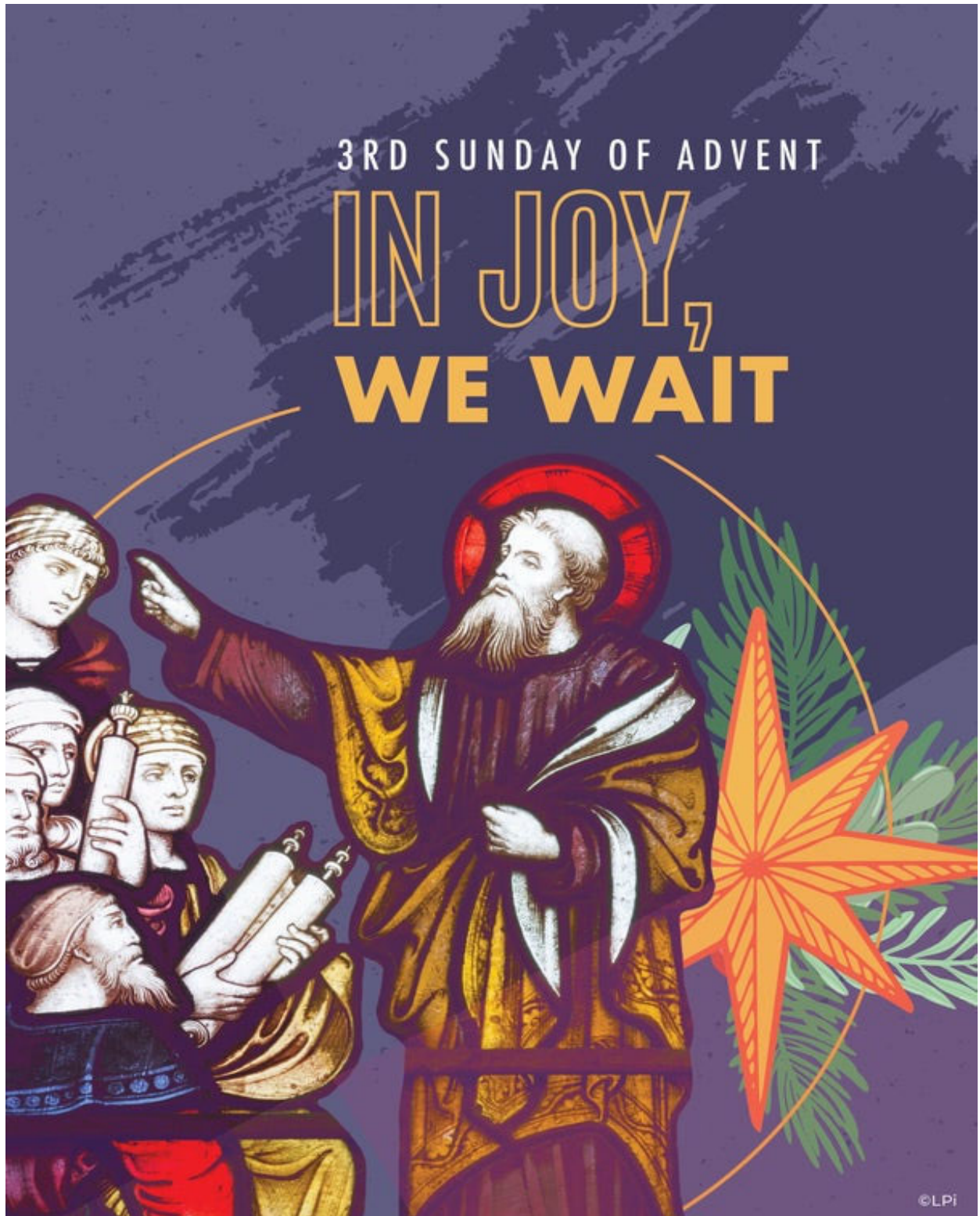

I would first like to thank our Finance Council members for helping prepare and present last year's Annual Financial Report at last weekend's Masses. Well done! 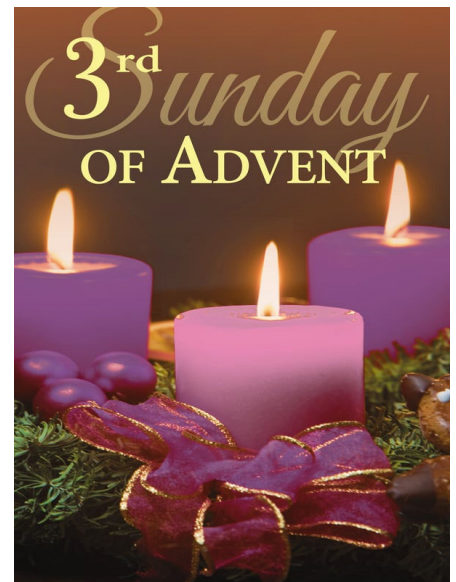
Advent is a time of expectation, of waiting for the Lord's coming at Christmas, the end of time, but also into our hearts. Waiting requires what most of us struggle with very much...patience. St. James says today: "***Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord.***" (Jas. 5:7). The virtue of patience is a sign that our faith and hope are strong, because we calmly wait for the Lord's word to be fulfilled, trusting that it surely will in time.

St. James gives us examples of patience, the first being farmers who must patiently wait for rains they can't control to soften and prepare the earth for a fruitful harvest. The farmer waits with patient hope, and he, without guarantees of when or if there will be enough rain that season. And there are other trials of farming including equipment failure or pests. We have many guarantees from the Lord that can surely be counted on for He has the power to keep His word.

The other image of patient waiting that St. James gives us is that of the Old Testament prophets, including St. John the Baptist, whose disciples asked Jesus on his behalf while John was imprisoned by Herod: "***Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?***" (Mt. 11:2). Like Simeon and Anna praying in the Temple waiting for the consolation of Israel, the faithful remnant of Judaism was on the lookout for God's action to rescue them.

One of the reasons that John the Baptist was so popular was that he was the first real prophet that God called in centuries! The Lord gradually revealed the plan of salvation over hundreds of years, through dozens of prophets. Think how blessed we are today in that the prophecies of the Messiah and God's coming salvation were somewhat mysterious, and it was uncertain when or how they would be fulfilled. A close analogy for us is the certainty of Jesus Christ's coming at the end of time. We have known for certainty that He is coming in glory, but we don't know when, we must wait in patience and be attentive.

Jesus wants to help us now, to encourage us in our waiting, He knows that we need Him right now. ***Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand.***

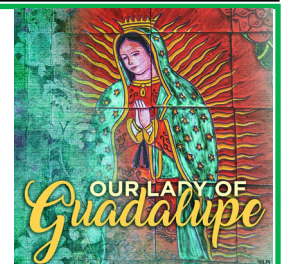

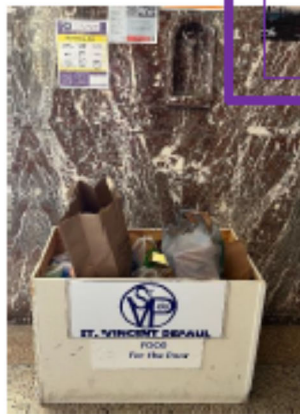

Dear Friends in Christ,


On the Third Sunday of Advent, our parishes will be conducting the Retirement Fund for Religious collection, an annual appeal that benefits nearly 25,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. Our senior religious are a treasure—both for their service to our Church and for the ways their prayer and witness enrich our faith. “Planted in the house of the Lord, they shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall bear fruit even in old age” (Ps 92:14-15). As I reflect on the ministry of women and men religious—past and present—I am grateful for the ways they have shaped my own faith. I also value the tremendous service they have offered our Archdiocese. Perhaps you, too, recall an older religious who made a positive difference in your life.

Most senior religious worked many years for little pay, leaving their religious communities with a shortage of retirement savings. Rising health-care costs and decreased income compound the challenge to meet day-to-day needs for medications, nursing assistance, and other necessities. Donations to the Retirement Fund for Religious provide financial support that helps religious communities care for aging members while ensuring younger ones can continue the good works of their elders.

Our Virtue for December: Generosity

What is it?

Generosity:

The willingness to give help or support that goes beyond what is expected especially to our brothers and sisters in Christ who are most in need. It is giving of ourselves with a spirit of willingness and cheerfulness.

Who is our Saint?

St. Nicholas

Saint Nicholas was a bishop who provided for the poor and sick and is the basis for the popular character of Santa Claus. Saint Nicholas was born circa 280 in Patara, Lycia, an area that is part of present-day Turkey. He lost both of his parents as a young man and reportedly used his inheritance to help the poor and sick. A devout Christian, he later served as bishop of Myra, a city that is now called Demre. There are many legends about Saint Nicholas of Myra. One story tells how he helped three poor sisters. Their father did not have enough money to pay their dowries and thought of selling them into servitude. Three times, Saint Nicholas secretly went to their house at night and put a bag of money inside. The man used the money so that one of his daughters could marry. On the third visit, the man saw Saint Nicholas and thanked him for his kindness. He also reportedly saved three men who were falsely imprisoned and sentenced to death. Several sources state Saint Nicholas is believed to have died on December 6, 343. Over the years, stories of his miracles and work for the poor spread to other parts of the world. He became known as the protector of children and sailors and was associated with gift-giving.



How Can We Live it?

- Everyone in the house chooses a family member and commits to doing at least one act of kindness and generosity for that person each week.
- Choose a charity to give to as a family.
- Participate in parish opportunities for service and giving such as our Food Pantry and St. Vincent de Paul Society

Lord Jesus, teach me to be generous; teach me to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labor and not to seek reward, except that of knowing that I do your will. Amen

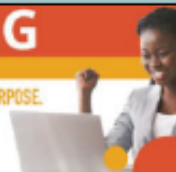
