

FROM FR. MIKE

This weekend kicks off Catholic Schools Week reminding us all of the importance of passing on the faith to our children through parish schools. We currently have 201 students in the school and a wonderful array of teachers and administrators to support them. Last weekend some of our school families spoke eloquently at the Masses about how important our school is to their child's development spiritually, emotionally, academically, and physically. The school and parish here at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity helps families to grow in their relationship with the Lord and each other.

Our principal, Dr. Kristine Hillmann, rightly reminds us that the best way to increase enrollment in the school is by word-of-mouth referrals. Even if you don't have a child in the school yourself you could make mention of the solid academic and Catholic faith formation available here to a colleague at work, friend, or loved one. That holds true for our religious education program as well.

How providentially fitting that the Gospel for this Sunday kicking off Catholic Schools Week is the Beatitudes from the Lord's Sermon on the Mount. Like Moses who climbed a mountain and delivered God's Law, Jesus climbed a mount and deepened what had come before. All of the beatitudes are relevant for our times. The call to be poor in spirit in an opulent yet depressed age. We are called to be pure/clean of heart in a time when superficiality and "the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—comes not from the Father but from the world."

We can also think of all those Christians throughout the world who are being persecuted for their faith in Christ and be encouraged by Jesus' words that their "reward will be great in heaven." The Lord also calls blessed the meek, merciful, and the peacemakers. There can be so much strident, aggressive polarization in the world and sadly in the Church that it is good to be reminded of the necessity of these calming virtues if we are serious in following Christ.

The meekness that Our Lord praises is not weakness but strength. Meekness is the virtue that keeps our anger under control. St. Thomas says: "Meekness makes a man master of himself." When we're prone to being quick tempered in the car, with family, or at work it's a sign that we have not yet acquired the virtue. St. Paul exhorts: "Get rid of all bitterness, all passion and anger, harsh words, slander, and malice of every kind" (Eph. 4:30).

The saintly rule of thumb is this: we should stand with great courage for the glory of God and all that is good and true...while at the same time we should practice lamb-like meekness in the face of personal slights against ourselves. This is true for Jesus who zealously drove out the money changers in the Temple... "my Father's house should be a house of prayer". But then in His passion we see how Jesus patiently endured mockery and torture and could say only while being crucified: "forgive them Father for they know not what they do." Jesus Christ showed strength of conviction and meekness at the same time.

It's very easy for unholy anger to flare up in us. There's far too much animosity in the world as it is. While we should not lose our zeal for Christ and His Church, the Lord is telling us that we will be blessed when we respond to bit-

terness with gentle kindness. When we live this way, we have the Lord's beautiful promise:

"Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

This year we need your support for this long-standing, well attended parish family tradition.


