

From Cardinal Cupich...

Today, as Jesus continues his Sermon on the Mount he opens our eyes to how God is present to us through his Son who walks with us in all of our joys and sorrows, our challenges and opportunities. Jesus tells us that when we fully trust Him and place our lives in His hands, we find the grace and strength to leave behind anger and embrace peace, to leave behind an adulterous and unfaithful mindset and embrace faithful love, to leave behind our hesitations and deceptions and embrace simple and direct truth.

In the depths of our hearts each of us truly desires the peace, fidelity, and truth Jesus offers us, for we know how much we need these gifts. We suffer from divisions in society, in our families and yes, even in the Church. We feel vulnerable in the aftermath of the pandemic and our own personal and family illnesses. We have fears about our financial insecurity and the safety of our families, and we are troubled by the threats which wars and conflicts bring to world stability. So, walking on the road with Jesus is urgent and necessary for us. But, as soon as we do so, we recognize as true the words of Sirach today, "if you trust in God, you too shall live". And we come to know that this new life in Christ is a grace this world cannot give, for "eye has not seen, and ear has not heard what God has prepared for those who love him."

This truth Jesus proclaims in the Sermon on the Mount has inspired us to choose as this year's theme for the Annual Catholic Appeal, Walking on the road with Jesus. I invite you to see this year's appeal as an opportunity to reclaim our identity, a sense of ourselves, as God's pilgrim people who are on the way, on the road with Jesus. And as we walk together, we are changed, for by being on the road with each other Jesus lifts us up from a narrow individualism and links us to each other. Being on the road, also means none of us has arrived, but that we are staying with each other to make sure no one is left behind and we all keep going.

Our participation in the Appeal is an expression of who we are as a people walking on the road with Jesus. And our support of the Appeal is more important than ever. Together, we join hands to help struggling parish communities, schools, religious education and ministry formation programs in the Archdiocese. We also take by the hand those who are weak in the world through our initiatives for justice, peace, and respect for human life, as well as through Catholic Relief Services, which allows us to be present to people suffering from illnesses, natural disasters, and war.

Walking on the road with Jesus—that is who we are. As your financial circumstances permit, please join me and other Catholics in making a gift to the Annual Appeal. I promise that the Archdiocese will be respectful of your sacrificial offering and be a good steward of your gift. And once your parish meets its goal, proceeds return to your parish to support its mission in your local community.

We must rediscover and cherish silence at Mass



(From an address by Pope Francis to participants in the course "Living Liturgical Action Fully," January 20, 2023)

"...I urge you to cultivate silence. In this age, we talk, we talk. ... Silence. Especially before the celebrations — a moment that is at times taken for a social gathering. We talk: "Ah, how are you? Is everything

going well? Why not?" Silence helps the assembly and concelebrants to concentrate on what is to be done. Often sacristies are noisy before and after celebrations, but silence opens and prepares for the mystery: it is silence that enables you to prepare for the mystery, it permits its assimilation, and lets the echo of the Word that is listened to resound. Fraternity is beautiful; greeting one another is beautiful, but it is the encounter with Jesus that gives meaning to our gathering, to our coming together. We must rediscover and cherish silence!

GOSPEL MEDITATION - 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's often said that the Catholic Church lays heavy rules on her members, rules that can almost seem impossible. Mass every Sunday? No lying ever? Sexual purity all the time? I recently said to some non-Catholic friends that more than fifty adults were baptized at my parish at the Easter Vigil. One responded spontaneously with shock, "Why would anyone do that?" In other words, why would someone willingly place themselves in a system with such demanding and rigorous rules?

Of course, no one in the history of religions is more demanding and rigorous than Jesus himself. In the Sermon on the Mount, he says you have to be holier than pharisees or you're out. He says if you call someone a fool, you go to fiery Gehenna. He says you can't even look at a woman with lust or you're guilty of adultery (which was punishable by death). To top it all off, he says you can't even get divorced and re-married. Doesn't he know these are basically impossible demands? What world is he living in?

The new one, actually. He is the new world. Jesus' words aren't meant to condemn. They are meant to signal something new, a restored humanity. Jesus doesn't just give external laws; he gives us his Holy Spirit to internalize the law through love. He wants to fill us with his love. That's what the Church exists to do. Love demands extraordinary things. The "demands" of the Church only make sense because she is filled with Jesus' love. That wildly demanding love is why we are Catholic.


