A new school year is almost upon us. This week all parish and school staff will be gathering for a morning of recollection. We have some new staff and teachers who are excited to help make the whole parish the best it can be in the Lord, please pray for us especially this week. You will notice some long-planned projects coming to completion. The lettering and color logo on the school look great, "St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Catholic School" along with "Wisdom, Worship, Works: Faith and Education."

I know that the landscaping along the diagonal parking on Moody in front of the junior high building has needed some work for a while. Now it has been trimmed, weeded, and has fresh mulch and some perennial flowers being planned by the Girl Scouts. The gymnasium too has new lettering on the front, and a beautiful facelift inside. Its vestibule has been repainted as well as the interior with the school colors of purple and gold. The inner gym entranceway will be dedicated in honor of Frank Monaco. The biography plaque and tribute to him are still being planned for all the good work Frank did in coaching and managing the sports programs over the years for the kids of the neighborhood.

There are so many other capital projects being planned including ongoing roofing and tuckpointing for the campus buildings in order of priority. The new church sign is also being designed but will be more of a "parish" sign, since the church will always be under its dedicated name under the patronage of St. Tarcissus, as the cornerstone says. The new signage in front of the church will say "St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish" for those coming in from the parking lot.

In the end though, paint, landscaping, brick and mortar signs aren't what the campus is all about, while they can inspire us. This place, every building, is intended to make Jesus Christ known and loved. Ideally, every person passing through our midst should know who we are and what we are about as Catholic disciple of Christ.

This weekend we have the Gospel of Jesus walking on water and Peter walking out to Him, but then sinking at the sight of the storm. When the disciples first saw Jesus, in the middle of the night, walking on water, they thought he was a ghost/spirit and were terrified. The Gospel says that *"at once Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."* The Greek that we render as "it is I" is "Ego eimi" which literally means "I AM." You notice the different point, Jesus didn't just tell them to not be afraid because he wasn't a ghost, "it's me, no worries." He used the divine name "I AM" which means don't be afraid, I'm God, I'm in charge.

The Lord called Peter to faith even in the storm, for He has power over the storms and over all things. Jesus Christ can calm any storm and solve all the problems of life which all will be resolved by the end of the world. But for now, Jesus is asking that we trust Him, focus on Him, listen to Him, while the storms rage around us. In time they will subside, and our own faith may be strengthened.

Perhaps we are like Peter and at times lose our focus and become afraid. We know we can call out as he did "*Lord, save me!*" Your brother in Christ, Fr. Mike





In the Gospel today, Jesus immediately stretched out His hand and caught Peter, and said to him: "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"




If so...WE NEED YOUR HELP!

NationalStep-by-Step Walk Through the MassEucharisticDo This in Remembrance of Me, Part 2: GenuflectionRevivalBy FR. LUKE SPANNAGEL



As we arrive at the church to join together with Christ in his perfect offering to the Father, our first gesture at the church door is to bless ourselves with holy water. After we have recalled our Baptism by making the Sign of the Cross with water from the font, the next thing we do is look for a place to sit. Before we slide into the pew, however, if the Blessed Sacrament is present in the sanctuary of the church, we genuflect.

You will see the priest and servers genuflect at times during the Mass. When the tabernacle with the Most Blessed Sacrament is present in the sanctuary of the church, the priest and servers genuflect when they approach the altar at the beginning of Mass and when they depart from it after the final blessing (General Instruction for the Roman Missal, no. 274; Ceremonies of the Modern Roman Rite, no. 199). The priest also genuflects at the altar after the elevation of the consecrated host, after the elevation of the chalice, and before receiving Holy Communion (GIRM, no. 274). The priest's genuflection at these points in the Mass helps us recall the incredible gift of Jesus present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Since during Mass, the focus is on the altar, you will notice that at other times during the Mass, the ministers bow as they cross the sanctuary.

Why Catholics Genuflect

What is a genuflection, and why do we genuflect? The simple answer is that when we genuflect, we touch our right knee to the floor to honor Jesus, who is really present in the tabernacle!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines genuflection as "a reverence made by bending the knee, especially to express adoration of the Blessed Sacrament" (CCC, Glossary). By genuflecting or bowing deeply in a spirit of prayer and as a sign of adoration of the Lord, "we express our faith in the real presence of Christ under the species of bread and wine" (CCC, no. 1378). To honor the true presence of Jesus Christ, all who pass before the Most Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass, as well as when entering or leaving the church, should genuflect. If genuflecting is physically difficult, a bow is a reverent substitute.

Say "Hi" to Jesus

One of my favorite memories as a priest was teaching religion class to young children. Often we met in the church itself rather than the classroom. I wanted to show them the sacred art in the church, as well as the sacred vessels and books used at Mass. The first time we entered the church, I taught them to genuflect. Of course, we had to start with learning which was our right knee and which was our left knee! Next, we practiced folding our hands and putting our right knee down to the floor. Week after week, I noticed how the children were improving their form as well as their reverence. At the end of the year, when we were reviewing what we had learned, I asked the children: "Why do we genuflect when we come in the church?" One of them smiled and eagerly responded, "To say hi to Jesus and to honor him." I couldn't have said it better!

The next time you enter a church, allow your eyes to be drawn to the sanctuary, altar, and tabernacle in the front of the church. In Catholic churches, a candle is kept burning next to the Tabernacle to indicate and honor the presence of Christ. Seeing the candle, called a sanctuary lamp, we can recognize that Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist and give Him the great honor that He deserves. When we genuflect, we make an act of humility that acknowledges the greatness of God and confesses that Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist is God with us. Jesus Christ, who loves us perfectly, who died for our sins and rose in triumph—Jesus Christ is there before us! While it is true that when we genuflect we honor Christ and profess our belief that he is present there, it is also a great honor for us, for in doing so we remember that we are part of God's beloved family. Pause and think about that for a moment.
