

FROM FR. MIKE

This weekend as we begin Advent, with its reminders of the Son of God's entry into the world, we also take stock as a parish with our Annual Report. I would like to thank our Finance Council in a special way for all its dedication and competence in preparing and presenting this report to all of you and for advising me: Mike Parilla (Director of Parish Operations), Dr. Kristine Hillmann (School Principal), Bill O'Hara (Chair), John Fiore, Donna Quirk, Tim Jacobs, and Donna Kay (Bookkeeper).

The Annual Report published in this bulletin includes both the Statement of Financial Activity and Statement of Financial Position for the FY ending June 30th, 2023. Overall we have decreased the deficits, though they are still significant and we have slightly increased church side revenue. Your generous donations and the assets from sales are being well spent. The ongoing capital projects continue apace, this year we will focus on campus roofs: the church and some of the school roofs. Please refer also to the special insert in this bulletin which is the full commentary from the Finance Council including some updates about the property sales and good news about debt forgiveness from the Archdiocese.

The most important sign of growth at any parish is an increase in faith, which usually manifests in ministry involvement, prayer opportunities, good works, and of course, Sunday Mass attendance. Jesus Christ, present to us in the Eucharist, is the source of our strength for evangelization and ministry. We now publish every month in the bulletin the monthly offertory as well as the average Sunday Mass attendance. Our attendance has increased this year from last year by about 70 people per weekend, a small sign that the Holy Spirit is active, but the fields are still ripe for the harvest.

One of the things we have been most pleased with this past year was the introduction of the Rescue Project evangelization program. The first offering had 29 participants and about ten volunteers involved over the eight weeks of sessions. One word that was used repeatedly by the respondents was that they a had a "transformative" experience! The participants gathered for a meal in small groups of about 6-8, watched a powerful video from Fr. John Riccardo (founder of the Rescue Project), had small group discussions. The whole series had a retreat toward the end. I led a small prayer team before each session that prayed a rosary before the Lord for each participant by name, which also happened at the Spanish prayer group. I'd like to thank Ashley Guinn for spearheading this work with the other volunteers, it has born some fruit!

We start Advent today, the period when we not only prepare for Christ's coming at Christ-mas but also His second coming at the end of time. Over the last few weeks the Readings have focused quite a bit on Christ's second coming and this week the Lord gives us a specific command to be "watchful." "Watch, therefore; you do not know when the lord of the house is coming whether at evening, or at midnight, or in the morning...may he not come suddenly and find you sleeping."

Jesus' command to be watchful even to the point of not being able to sleep might sound exhausting and beyond our power, therefore causing us fear. But what the Lord wants is for us to not

be surprised and therefore unprepared. When a teacher repeatedly tells students to be ready for a quiz any day of the week, when the quiz comes, they have no reason to act surprised, rather they should be ready with pencils sharpened. So too with us, we know Jesus is coming back at some point in glory, or our lives end first, whichever it is, let's be ready with faith and love.







Happy New Year! (Actually, Happy Liturgical New Year!)

So why does the Church's new year begin before January? The liturgical year follows the life of Christ. We start off the new year with hope, as we commemorate the biblical events leading to the Annunciation and birth of Jesus.

Advent starts about four weeks before Christmas, on the Sunday closest to St. Andrew's Feast Day (November 30), but the number of days can fluctuate between 22 and 28 days.

This year, we only have 22 days to prepare our hearts and our homes to celebrate the birth of the newborn King! Religious Education families stopped by the Advent Fair during RE classes to get ideas for family activities; from how to make-your-own Nativity Advent Calendar, to the Mary on the Mantel alternative to Elf on the Shelf, to the Giving Manger that focuses children on the real meaning of Christmas.
