3RD SUNDAY OF LENT

Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." - Jn 4:10

"Stop making my Father's house a marketplace." Jesus Christ spoke these words, as reported in the Gospel of John, after he had aggressively driven the money changers from the Temple. We also know from the Synoptic Gospels that He said: "My house shall be a house of prayer, but you are making it a den of thieves" (Mt. 21:13). The Lord is reminding, even with righteous anger, that the physical houses of worship, like our churches where He is present, should be places of prayer. Jesus dwells in the tabernacle in the Blessed Sacrament and He also wants to dwell within us, in our hearts and minds.

Prayer is first a relationship with God, our hearts and minds are raised to our Father who knows what we need before we even ask and wants to provide for us.

I recently reached out to the local Carmelite Monastery in Des Plaines to learn more about the spirituality of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity and had some nice conversation with one of the nuns there. They also promised to pray for us. Sr. Josephine encouraged me and the whole parish to pray to the Holy Spirit, and ask to receive the Holy Spirit for ourselves and for the parish. The Carmelites are very inspiring.

Sr. Josephine told me a story about the founding of their house in Des Plaines. The Archbishop at the time, Cardinal Stritch, asked Mother Agnes: "What do you do?" and she probably presuming the Cardinal knew of their charism she mentioned the tasks that the Carmelites sisters engaged in to support the community like making liturgical or devotional items. Here is Cardinal Stritch's response, which they take very much to heart:

"We don't need you to make vestments or rosaries or altar breads. Do you pray? We need your prayers. Pray for this Archdiocese, the Archbishop, the priests and all the faithful. Pray that we will be what we ought to be."

The Carmelites carry out this mission of prayer without ceasing, but we too are meant, as our state in life allows, to keep our minds and hearts raised to God in prayer.

The parish has so many opportunities for prayer, especially during Lent with Stations of the Cross, Vespers on Mondays, Adoration, Confessions and Mass on Tuesdays, or just quiet time with the Lord throughout the day. Our own homes, the domestic church, can be places of prayer, communal prayer before meals, before bedtime, perhaps with the rosary or part of it.

Cardinal Stritch's question can stay with us too: "Do you pray?"

If we wrestle with how to begin personal prayer with the Lord, it could begin simply by placing ourselves in the Lord's presence, in our "inner room" and thanking Him for something in our day or life in general. We can thank the Lord for His blessings. Jesus also tells us to ask for what we need, with persistence. We must try to listen too to the quiet voice within, for He is speaking and wants to strengthen and guide us if we would let him.

Sr. Josphine also sent me a booklet about St. Elizabeth of the Trinity with a beautiful quote. I will leave it with you. It is about how we should talk to Jesus in prayer:

"Let yourself be loved ... act as you would with someone you love; it's so simple. There is no need for beautiful thoughts, only an outpouring of your heart" (Letter 273 to her mother).

May our Lenten practices and prayer be fruitful and help us to grow in love of God and neighbor.





Dear Parents, Parishioners and Friends of St. Elizabeth,

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity officially opened its doors, amid a pandemic, to students in the fall of 2020, after merging with St. Thecla and Pope Francis Global Academy - North Campus. Since then, we have remained open, offering in-person education for all our students, when other schools did not. We are very fortunate that new families joined St. Elizabeth during these past few years, because we remained open - and provided a Catholic education to all students.

In 2017, Illinois created the Invest in Kids Act, which allowed students to attend a private school with partial or full tuition covered, if they reside in a failing public school district as well as showed financial need. This program, also known as the Tax Credit Scholarship Program, awarded about 14% of our student population the funds to attend St Elizabeth, in the amount of around \$125K. Unfortunately, the Illinois legislature did not renew this program which leaves many families unsure of how they will afford private education. Schools are working tirelessly to work out a budget that will allow their students to remain in school.


I write to all of you today to ask for your financial support to help keep these students at St. Elizabeth. The boards of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity created the Trinity Tuition Assistance Fund, to help cover the costs of tuition for families in need. The tuition for one child per year is \$6840. I am asking for you to give what you can, whether it be \$500 or \$5000! Every little bit helps to ensure these 25 students remain at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity for years to come. And, I hope to continue to grow our Trinity Tuition Assistance Fund, so that anyone who wants to be a part of St. Elizabeth in the future, is able, no matter their financial situation.

We likely recognize the phrases "We pray to the Lord" and "Lord hear our prayer" from the General Intercessions at Mass. After the Creed, as a conclusion to the Liturgy of the Word, the community prays together, asking God for various needs. This part of the Mass has several names, including the **Prayer of the Faithful, General Intercessions, Universal Prayer**, or **Petitions**.

As the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* teaches, "In the Universal Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful, the people respond in some sense to the Word of God which they have received in faith and, exercising the office of their baptismal Priesthood, offer prayers to God for the salvation of all. It is desirable that there usually be such a form of prayer in Masses celebrated with the people, so that petitions may be offered for holy Church, for those who govern with authority over us, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world" (*GIRM*, 69).

Of course, praying together as Christians has been part of our life from the beginning. As Charles Belmonte notes, "To pray for the needs of the Church and of the world is an early Christian custom. St. Paul admonishes Timothy, one of his disciples: 'First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity.' (<u>1 Tim 2:1–</u> <u>2</u>)" (*Understanding the Mass*, p. 104). Thus, it shouldn't surprise us that this part of the Mass stretches all the way back to those earliest descriptions of the Mass, including the one by St. Justin Martyr (+165 AD).

The Church United in Prayer

The names "General Intercessions" and "Universal Prayer" instruct us on the composition of these prayers. They are prayed in a general way for wide-ranging needs, typically following a pattern of praying for the needs of the Church, for public authorities and the salvation of the world, for those burdened by any kind of difficulty, and for the local community. Often, the final intercession will include prayers for the deceased. While these prayers are envisioned to be "general," the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* does note that for a particular celebration like a Confirmation or a wedding, "the series of intentions may be concerned more closely with the particular occasion" (*GIRM*, 70). After the series of petitions, the Prayer of the Faithful ends with the concluding prayer said by the priest, asking God to accept our petitions.

As the name "Prayer of the Faithful" indicates, from the earliest times the baptized members of the congregation (the faithful) took part in this prayer (Those who weren't yet baptized were dismissed after the readings and homily so that they could further study and prepare to be received into the Church). In a wonderful way, the Prayer of the Faithful highlights one of the great privileges we have as God's people: being able to join together in asking God for what we need. Having just listened to God's Word and professed together our Faith through the Creed, we are then standing united together in faith as we ask God for what we need. Jesus has told us that our prayers are powerful when even two agree on what to pray for (<u>Matthew 18:19</u>). Just imagine how powerful our prayer is when the whole Church is joined together in union. It is amazing to think about!
