Summer is moving along and while projects are being completed, there is always so much more on the docket. One exciting project

that is finally being realized is getting the Divine Mercy image mounted on the Milwaukee Ave. side of the gymnasium, viewable from the street through the old Produce Center parking lot. As we become a more evangelizing parish the Divine Mercy image is a great way to give witness to Jesus. The Lord Himself promises to bless us through it as He told St. Faustina:

"By means of this image, I shall be granting many graces to souls; so let every soul have access to it." (St Faustina Diary, 570). "Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush lies the greatness of this image, but in My grace." (313)

Our world is filled with anxiety and discord, the key to peace in this life is found in the simple words connected with the Divine Mercy image, "Jesus, I trust in you." We can't trust our own goodness, love or strength but we can trust the Lord. May this image be a source of comfort for people as they walk or drive by and may Christ bless our parish as we strive to love Him and our neighbor more.

Chris told me that without our parish's generosity and help, he would likely be on the street.

We are also looking for more affordable housing for Chris and have some money to cover his rent as he finds employment. Also, now that we are in the practical stages of helping Chris (and Michael) you may wish to be involved as a friend and support to them.
