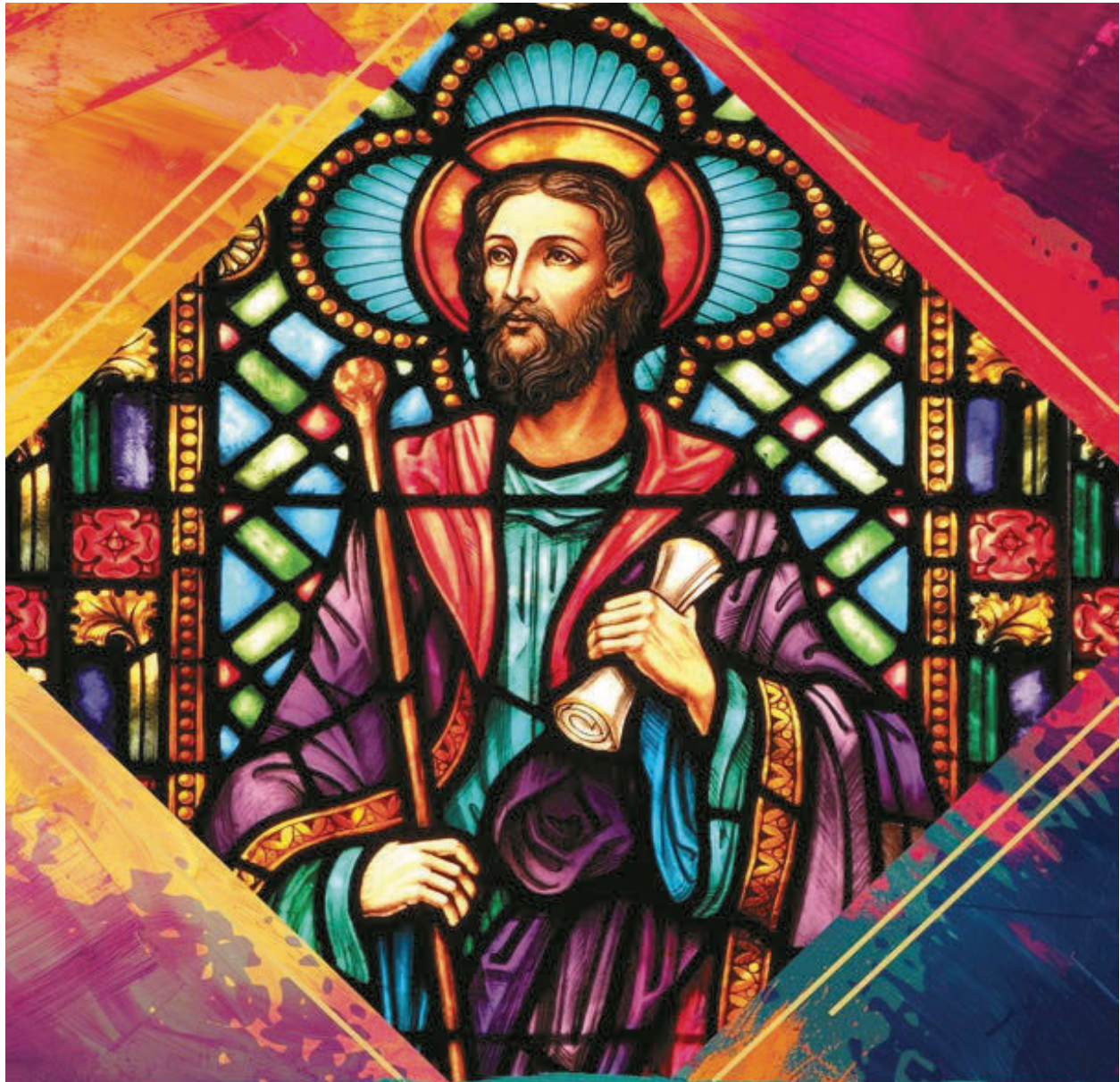




# ST. ELIZABETH of the Trinity

**3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me.  
- Lk 4:18

I am writing this article on Monday, January 20<sup>th</sup>, the federal holiday honoring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and the inauguration day for President Donald Trump. I know both hopes and fears are great right now at the beginning of this presidency with the early focus being on immigration. Cardinal Cupich has asked that his letter on how the Church can support immigrants in these uncertain times be made available to you. It is in this bulletin, please read it.

The Church reminds us that a country has two duties, the first being: *“The more prosperous nations are obliged as they are able to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin”* (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2241). We are certainly a prosperous nation that people long to come to find a better life. The American Dream is still sought after by many. Consider how the Holy Family had to flee to Egypt when the Lord was being hunted by King Herod and the Israelites were regularly reminded by God to not abuse or take advantage of the “resident alien” or immigrants among them.

We probably all know people, I know I do, who are not citizens yet but would like to be and they are both hard working, faithful and productive members of society and they come from many countries, not just Central or South America. Some people may just want to come to the U.S. on a work visa but many want to set up roots and be grateful citizens, which is what our country was built on. We should be open and generous to those who really want to be U.S citizens to build up the communities they live in. Having said these true things, a country also has a duty to maintain law and order for the common good, for we cannot give what we do not have.

The second duty a country has is to control the process of immigration and have legitimate expectations of immigrants: *“Political authorities, for the sake of the common good for which they are responsible, may make the exercise of the right to immigrate subject to various juridical conditions, especially with regard to the immigrants' duties toward their country of adoption. Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws and to assist in carrying civic burdens.”* (CCC 2241).

We have all witnessed the scandal of not having much security or process at the southern border which has led cities like our own, which are far away, to be stretched in our housing and social benefits beyond our capacity. Also, a non-secure border increases the horror of human and drug trafficking.

I’m sure we all hope that while criminals guilty of offenses other than being undocumented might be deported, that the good people trying to become U.S. citizens will still be given that chance. Cardinal Cupich’s letter includes a link with many resources available by the Church, including legal aid for those who might need advocacy, Catholic Charities for housing, and other supports.

Let us pray and be convinced that we can as a country both maintain a just order and process at our borders while at the same time allowing a reasonable pathway to citizenship for the many good people who want to be a part of and support this great country. As intentional Catholic disciples of Jesus we can and should be both pro-order and pro-immigrant at the same time.

# Totus Tuus Is Back! Save the Date!



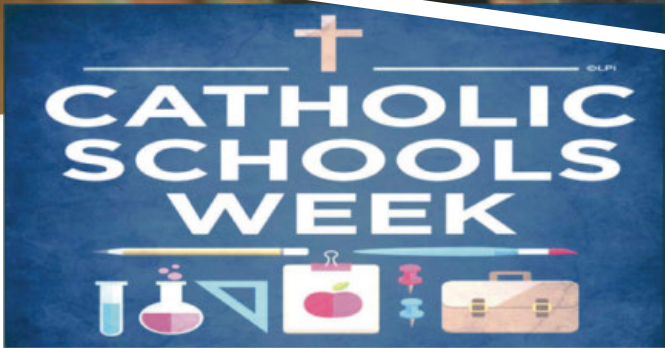
Totus Tuus is Returning to St. Elizabeth of the Trinity this summer July 6-11th. This is a great summer opportunity full of fun and faith formation.

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Christmas Eve, our Holy Father opened the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica inaugurating the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope. Indeed, Christ is our Hope and in Him we place our personal hopes for the year ahead. Yet amid this call to hope, many of our brothers and sisters on the margins are experiencing great fear and anxiety. I am thinking in particular of our immigrant communities.

Much has been said of what might happen to some of our neighbors beginning in the coming weeks and months. As people of hope, it is important that we do what is right and necessary to instill confidence in those who are afraid, letting them know that the Church is with them.

As the Body of Christ, we serve those in need, respecting and promoting the inherent dignity of every person who arrives on our doorstep. At the same time, parishes, schools and entities of the Archdiocese of Chicago must adhere to federal, state and local laws and regulations.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is working with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Catholic Charities, state and local governments and other groups to coordinate our activities of support in Cook and Lake Counties. As we are called to do, we will prioritize bringing Christ into this time of fear and uncertainty. By asking, "What is God telling us in this moment?" we help families see that God is with them, even in their fears. This approach—rooted in prayer, solidarity, and tangible action—demonstrates that the Catholic Church, through its unique resources and faith, offers a beacon of hope. Together, we bring love, accompaniment, and the reassurance that no one is alone.

Speaking this year to the ambassadors accredited to the Holy See, the Holy Father observed that migration governance needs to balance regulation with human rights and dignity. "We are quick to forget that we are dealing with people with faces and names." Pope Francis has also been clear that "the principle of safe and voluntary repatriation of those who are forced to flee must be strictly adhered to. No one should be repatriated to a country where they could face severe human rights violations or even death."

Let us continue to work together in this spirit, and be faith-filled instruments of mercy honoring the human dignity of all persons.

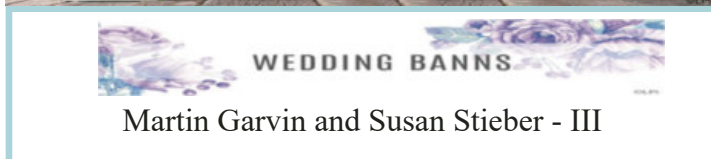
