


ST. ELIZABETH of the Trinity

I have some important and surprising news. I have been asked by Cardinal Cupich through our new Bishop, John Siemianowski, to take on a new pastorate. On July 1st this year, I will become the pastor of Our Lady of Ransom Parish in Niles, which is not too far away. While I had another year left on my term here as pastor, that parish needs a pastor, and they thought I would be a good fit for it so I was asked to take it. I just found out before writing this article, so it is as much a surprise for me as it is for you.

What now? St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish will be getting a new pastor (or administrator) on July 1st, but I am not sure yet who that will be. I know everyone wants this merger to be as successful as it can, and a seasoned priest is being sent and may already have been announced by the time you read this. I and the staff are meeting and will make sure the transition goes as smoothly as possible. I know you will be as welcoming to the new priest as you were to me.

On a person note, I want to thank all of you for a wonderful eight years being on site here, time really flies doesn't it? It will be sad to leave but I have learned to accept that God's will is revealed through our lives and superiors, the promise of obedience helps to clarify the Lord's will. While the merger was certainly hard for everyone and there is still so much to be done, the Lord has blessed us all. There will be graces offered in this next phase of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish with a new leader with fresh perspectives, ideas, and gifts.

On a reflective note, as much as things may change, they also stay the same. I was thinking about when I first came to this parish and the first homily I gave in this church on July 1st, 2017. I asked you to pray for me and introduce yourselves so that I could gradually learn your names (I know many of you!). I also shared what I thought was the essential purpose of a good parish which I think is as relevant now as it was before the merge:

Our Lord tells us that to be His disciple we must love Him even more than our family and friends. We have to put Him first, only then do we have life! If we put Christ first, then everything else falls into its proper place.

At a previous parish assignment, the temporary principle noted of the school there: "You've got three different school mission statements and they're all a bit flowery." He was a WWII buff and so gave a suggestion: "We need to be like the Allies in WWII with something simple like "Get to Berlin."

The basic mission we have as Catholics could be phrased in different ways: "be a saint, follow Christ fully, grow in holiness, get to heaven." These are all getting at the point the Lord is making. The value of parish ministries or activities could be gauged by asking questions like "how will this help the people to know and live their Catholic faith? Will this decision help them to grow in holiness and follow Jesus?"

Our Lord Himself put it this way "Whoever loses his life for My sake ... will find it.""

The mission hasn't changed in eight years...or two thousand years. Please pray for me and your new priest and be assured of my love and prayers for you.

A STEWARDSHIP REMINDER

Please consider making a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- (1) If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- (2) The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- (3) Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now. 

Living a Eucharistic Life during Lent Sr. Mary Catherine Kasuboski, TOR

What do we do when we want to give someone a gift, but have no money? We usually have to get creative, and often the result is a gift that includes something of ourselves.

For many years, I have served our community as the General Treasurer, which means I manage the material resources for the whole community. It is a role that involves a massive amount of responsibility, leaving me very little time to devote to our communal ministries. However, I feel within me a deep hunger to do ministry, because I didn't enter religious life to take care of the finances.

A Hidden Opportunity

Recently, after a couple of ministry events came up for me and subsequently fell through, I felt rather disappointed. As I took my still hungry heart to the Lord, I felt led to consider my present circumstances replete with ministry opportunities, not to people outside the community, but to my own sisters with whom I live.

At first, I didn't find this very exciting, but when I began to accept it more deeply, I realized the Lord was offering me opportunities to live a Eucharistic life at every moment of every day—offering a gift of myself in little, often hidden ways that might never be considered "ministries" by anyone else. If a sister comes to my office needing a check to purchase something and I give her a loving smile with it, I have given a gift of myself.

When we are at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we witness Jesus offering himself to the Father as he did on the Cross, and we are called to participate in that by offering ourselves (and all aspects of our lives) with Jesus to the Father. When we leave Mass, we are called to extend that self-offering and live a Eucharistic life by offering ourselves to one another in love.

Holiness through "Little Gifts of Self"

This is a path to holiness that is open to every person. Traditionally, Lent calls us to focus on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. "Sacrifices," "penances," and "death-to-self" are common words we hear. These can have a negative connotation for us and even subtly cause us to focus on our own efforts. Maybe what we really need to focus on are little gifts of self—doing positive acts that help us love God, others, and even ourselves better.

Here are a few ideas that can be springboards for your own creativity:

- Give a word of encouragement and/or affirmation to someone.
- Be creative and intentional about asking a friend (or family member) how he/she is doing today, and be prepared to listen to the response.
- Take 5 minutes to look out the window, find some beauty, thank God for it, and ask for the grace to see beauty in the people you encounter today.
- Get to Mass 5 minutes earlier than you usually do and focus your mind on God.
- Fast from social media platforms for 15 minutes and use that time to pray instead.
- When people interrupt your work or conversations, receive them with openness and gratitude for the opportunity to serve them.
- When you hear gossip or are tempted to it yourself, say something positive and uplifting instead.

Then, when you go to Mass, try to remember to offer the little things you've done, what you've failed to do, and your very self to Jesus in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, and allow all these little offerings of love to bind your heart more closely to him. Jesus delights to see us find creative ways of giving gifts of ourselves to one another, so let us ask him to help us live a more Eucharistic life today.
