


# MAY 18, 2025 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER





# May 18, 2025

When I was young, like many boys, I grew up loving to play video and computer games. Most games allowed you to save your progress and restart as needed until you won or got the result you wanted. However, some games didn't allow this and some even added the "iron man" mode. That mode meant that once your game character died, it was over, there were no "redoes", no restarting, no save point to go back to. Such consequences meant that every decision mattered with the game, hours of focus poured into the game could be lost, which made it much more meaningful if not also a bit stressful.

With so many things going on already this month of May, I haven't gotten around to mentioning that this is the month of our Blessed Mother. As I write this it is May 13<sup>th</sup>, the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima when the Virgin Mary first appeared to three shepherd children in Portugal in 1917. Her message to them and to the world was basically a reminder that our life on earth in some sense is in "iron man" mode, meaning, once we die, there are no restarts, or do-overs. We have to make the most of the time we have been given, so Our Lady called us to pray the rosary and repent for our sins and do penance for others so that they would convert too. I know the Fatima message is not a jolly one but we need to be regularly reminded to make the most of this life, for we only get one life to make the most of.

--- How do people know that we are Catholics? I am blessed as a priest that my clerical garb is easy identifier for me, it breaks the ice with no words needed. Many people wear crosses or holy medals that people can see, that marks us as Christ's disciples. But today, Jesus gave us the real way we can be known as His: *"This is how all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."* It is a rather sobering thought to ask ourselves: "Do others know that I'm Jesus' disciples based on how I love others?"

We often think of discipleship in terms of our intellectual convictions, that aspect of faith which is about beliefs like the Creed. We believe all sorts of unique things as Catholics that Jesus Christ revealed to us: the truth of the Real Presence in the Eucharist, the reality of purgatory, the seven sacraments, the office of the papacy, and so forth. The intellectual aspect of faith is essential because we can't love what we don't know. The Lord wants us to know Him through His works and teachings so as to love Him and our neighbor all the more.

But today's teaching from Jesus focuses us on our will and how we choose to live in our daily lives towards others. Sadly, a person might believe all the right things and behave in the wrong ways. We have all experienced others, perhaps we ourselves, profess good and true

things, but undermine our witness by our slow response to do good. People hold Christians to high standards, because they expect us to live like Jesus. Gandhi was asked once why he never became a Christian and he responded: "I would have been a Christian if I ever met one." Sincere goodness can be more persuasive than truth.

"Say the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and the end of the war." Words spoken by our Blessed Mother Mary at Fatima



# Annual Report as of and for the Year Ended June 30, 2024

- 1. Financial highlights:
  - Total assets amounted to \$7,978,167 on June 30, 2024, an increase of \$974,072 or 14%, as compared to June 30, 2023, which is principally due to the net proceeds from the sale of St. Cornelius Church of \$968,113.
  - We continue to incur significant operating deficits (\$580,995) in FY 2024 and (\$382,864) in FY 2023. Although these deficits have been largely funded through investment returns earned on investing the proceeds from the sale of property, those investment returns are not guaranteed. As changes in the stock market occur, or as the proceeds from the property sale are used to fund capital expenditures, the amount of investment income available to cover the operating deficit will diminish.
  - Total operating revenue decreased by \$60,448 or 3%, which is largely due to decreased Parish / School revenue.
  - Total operating expenses increased by \$137,683 or 6%, which is largely due to staff changes, including the addition of a Facilities Manager to assist in managing the complexities of an aging campus or to address the growing number of facilities issue compounded by years of deferred maintenance, the addition of a full-time Director of Lifelong Formation, and expanding the Administrative Assistant role to a full-time position as well as increased employee benefit expenses, such as health insurance.
  - Significant non-recurring Extraordinary items include
    - The Archdiocese forgave \$684,062 of legacy Parish debt, the impact of which was largely offset by the one-time payment of the Parish Vitality tax of 8%, or \$676,515, paid to the Archdiocese from the proper ty sale gross proceeds.
    - Net proceeds from the sale of St. Cornelius Church totaled \$968,113. This is the final property sale of the merged Parishes and is accumulated with net proceeds from the other sales as reflected in Certificate of Deposit – Property sale proceeds and Investments – Property sale proceeds on the Statement of Financial Position.
- 2. As it relates to our Church:
  - Average weekly Sunday Mass attendance increased from 787 in FY 2023 to 843 in FY 2024
  - Number of Baptisms increased from 51 in FY 2023 to 61 in FY 2024
  - Number of First Communions increased from 60 in FY 2023 to 69 in FY 2024
  - Number of Confirmations decreased from 55 in FY 2023 to 48 in FY 2024
  - Number of Weddings stayed constant at 5 in FY 2023 and in FY 2024
  - Number of Funerals decreased from 69 in FY 2023 to 61 in FY 2024
- 3. As it relates to our Parish School:
  - School enrollment increased from 175 in FY 2023 to 177 in FY 2024



- We plan to have two Open Houses (one for just the PK-3 and Junior Kindergarten) as well as market Shadow Days during the 2025/2026 School Year. Also, we had approximately 10 families come through our most recent Open House, which is the largest we have had so far.
- While tuition and fees declined by \$134,000 or 12%, we saw an increase in grants and outside funding of \$39,000 or 26%. This was largely due to positive support we received for our very own, Trinity Tuition Assistance Fund, which was established as a result of the sunset of the Invest in Kids Act.
- We managed to keep overall operating expenses reasonably consistent with prior year an increase of approximately \$32,000 or 2% from FY 2023 to FY 2024
- 4. While we have net assets of \$7.5 million, those funds are already earmarked primarily for critical maintenance items that have been long deferred/dangerously deferred or something to that effect:
  - Reserves (a cushion against unforeseen circumstances, such as reduced funding, unexpected expenses, or economic downturns) \$2.0 million
  - Campus roof repairs \$1.5 \$2.0 million
  - Other capital projects and campus improvements \$2.0 million
  - Scholarships, Financial Aid and Other \$1.0 million
  - Parish Vitality Initiatives \$500,000

It currently costs approximately \$9,000 to provide the outstanding quality of academic, social and religious education that our parish school provides. Tuition, fundraising, and grants cover approximately \$7,000 per student.
