

# FROM FR. DEO

#### Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Peace be with you! I was ordained a priest sixteen years ago on August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009. As I reflect on my priestly call and service to the Church, my heart is filled with profound gratitude. Each day, I am humbled by the magnitude of God's gift, and I'm constantly inspired and strengthened by your faith, generosity, and prayers. Priesthood is not a solitary path; it is a shared calling, nurtured and sustained by the community it serves. I thank God daily for allowing me to serve you, and to walk with you as we grow together in faith and love. I would like to reflect on this Sunday's readings in relation to ministerial priesthood and to common priesthood (the priesthood we all share as the baptized).

This Sunday's Word of God invites us to ask ourselves: Where is my treasure? What am I building my life on? In other words, what matters in my life and what is my relationships with God, others, and earthly things? Qoheleth says: "Vanity of vanities! All is vanity." For him, worldly life is ultimately empty without God because material things cannot satisfy our deepest longings. In the second reading, St. Paul urges us to "Seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God." In the Gospel, Jesus warns against the danger of greed and the idolatry of material things. Jesus illustrates His teaching with the story of a wealthy man who said to himself: "I will store all my grain and my goods... then I will say to myself, 'You have plenty... rest, eat, drink, and be merry."" (Luke 12:19) But God calls him a fool because he built his life around possessions, and self-reliance, not on a relationship with God or service to others. He is not condemned for being successful, but for his self-centeredness. Jesus invites us to be "rich toward God", which means to live generously, selflessly, and sacrificially, imitating the example of Jusus Christ, the Hight Priest.

The priesthood is the opposite of the life of the rich fool. Instead of storing up treasures on earth, the priest gives up earthly wealth, comfort, and personal ambition to follow Christ in radical trust. He becomes a man set apart, not to build bigger barns, but to build the Kingdom of God. A priest's treasure is Christ Himself. His reward is not material success, but the joy of sharing his faith and bringing souls to God. In a world obsessed with power and accumulation of wealth, the priest stands as a **prophetic sign**. His life **consists in giving oneself away in love, but he does not do it alone.** The laity (parishioners) in collaboration with their pastors participate in the life and ministry of the Church by exercising their common priesthood received in Baptism. They do so by offering themselves and their gifts and sacrifices to God. (see, CCC, 1267-68) Concretely, the laity "cooperate with their pastors for the sake of the Church's growth and life through the exercise of different kinds of ministries. (See, Paul VI, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*,73) The recent Synod on Synodality has also emphasized that laypeople are not at service to the clergy, but we're all together at service for the mission of the Church. We are called to act together co-responsibly in the spirit of synodality. This is a way of life for the Church (parish).

Our parish ought to be a vibrant community of faith, and each of us is an important part of the Body of Christ. I therefore invite you to consider sharing your time, gifts, and heart through one of our many parish ministries. Whether you are new to the parish or have been with us for years, there is a place for you to grow, to serve, and to make a meaningful difference. Each ministry plays a vital role in building up our parish family and extending Christ's love beyond our church doors. No matter your age or stage of life, there is a ministry that needs your gifts. Besides the existing ministries such as liturgical ministries, faith formation & evangelization, outreach & service, parish life & fellowship, I invite you to consider joining our new ministries of "Sanctuary Angels" and "Church Decoration." As we prepare for a new school year and for Religious Education and Faith Formation, I kindly invite you to register your children and help them grow in their understanding of the Catholic faith, experience the love of God, and deepen their personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

I also ask that you please join us in praying the Novena for the Assumption starting on August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2025, after the 8:30 morning Mass.






