

FROM FR. DEO



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Peace be with you! I hope you're having a great summer! Last week, I met with our parish St. Vincent de Paul Conference, and I witnessed how they live the Gospel by serving Christ in the poor with love, respect, justice, and joy. We will continue to support them, and I encourage you to consider joining their ministry. At the meeting, I was amazed by people's introduction as "transplants" from the merged parishes. I'd like to reflect on that metaphor and its implications for the understanding of our Parish spiritual renewal.

It's been five years since the three parishes merged into St Elizabeth of the Trinity. In agriculture, transplant means that a plant's graft is cut, removed from its original place, and transferred to another. This process can be painful as it involves wounding (cutting), leaving and beginning anew, but the goal is not to harm but to give rise to something new. The transplant is successful when the grafted plant into another thrives and bears fruit. When applied to the merger, the transplant metaphor can explain the process we've undergone by forming a new identity out of the three communities. St Elizabeth of the Trinity has arisen from transplant to Jesus, the True Vine: "I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5). We're St Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish. Together, we've been grafted into something new, bigger, and more life-giving. We're to become a vibrant community of disciples that celebrates the one faith that unites us in the richness of our cultural and demographic diversity.

Five years into that process of building and becoming, our parish acknowledges the sadness, uncertainty, grief, loss of identity many might have endured. I hear the pain of those who are not yet healed, because you understandably still have memories of your place of baptism, marriage, education, and family belonging. But the Church is not mainly a building; it is a spiritual home. We must journey and heal together, making a home for everyone, especially by welcoming and even looking for those who feel left out or have gone to other places. I invite every parishioner to be intentionally welcoming and invite at least a friend or a neighbor to our church. Together we will seek ways to enhance our Sunday worship experience and satisfy the hunger of those longing for Jesus through our different ministries. This is the work of God we're called to carry out and pray for, as the readings of this Sunday remind us.

The key to our discipleship and community building is a life rooted in prayer. In the First Reading, Abraham's persistent prayer moves God to show mercy for the few innocent people. In the Gospel, the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray. Jesus responds with the *Our Father* — a prayer that centers us on God as a loving Father, and urges us to seek His will, and trust in His care. In the Our Father, Jesus is giving us a new vision of human relationships: that we all are children of God and thereby brothers and sisters. Our prayer, therefore, should be a way of entering in deep and trusting communion with God, which propels us to enter in communion with others through charity, hospitality, and forgiveness.

As a community of disciples, let us make our prayer the foundation of communion with God and our relationship with others. Let's not ask Jesus to say prayers, but to live in prayer and to make our lives pleasing to God our Father. Prayer is not about saying the right words; it's about building a relationship with our loving Father. God never gets annoyed by our prayers, nor does He get tired of hearing and answering them. We sometimes get tired of asking and even insisting. As Jesus and Abraham teach us, we pray persistently not to change God's mind but for God to change ours and make our will open to His Will. This week, let us echo the disciples' request: "Lord, teach me to pray with patience, persistence, and unwavering trust."


DID YOU KNOW?

GOSPEL MEDITATION - 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

(Luke 11:1-13)

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.





Thank you to everyone who came to renew their faith with a stronger prayer life.
















Pope Leo XIV's Prayer for Discernment

Holy Spirit, you, light of our understanding, gentle breath that guides our decisions, grant me the grace to listen attentively to your voice and to discern the hidden paths of my heart, so that I may grasp what truly matters to you, and free my heart from its troubles. I ask you for the grace to learn how to pause, to become aware of the way I act, of the feelings that dwell within me, and of the thoughts that overwhelm me which, so often. I fail to notice. I long for my choices to lead me to the joy of the Gospel. Even if I must go through moments of doubt and fatigue, even if I must struggle, reflect, search, and begin again... Because, at the end of the journey, your consolation is the fruit of the right decision. Grant me a deeper understanding of what moves me, so that I may reject what draws me away from Christ, and love him and serve him more fully. Amen.

The Pope's original prayer echoes the famous prayer of St. Augustine in the *Confessions*: "Oh God, let me know myself that I might know You!"

"In order to discern, it is necessary to place oneself in truth before God, to enter into oneself, to admit one's own weaknesses, and to ask the Lord for healing," explains the press release. "These are the steps to rebirth through an authentic relationship with God."

This process is known as discernment and helps Christians discover the path toward God - lived in the actions of every day - that already lies deep within our hearts.

Formation in discernment, "includes prayer, personal reflection, the study of Scripture and spiritual direction. Cultivating a deep relationship with Jesus is the most important aspect."


