




FROM FR. DEO



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Peace be with you! Some may be returning from vacation feeling tired, and others feeling anxious as they prepare to send kids to school. The Church is your home, a place not only of worship but of support, community, and healing. Christ continues to walk with us, and our parish is here to walk with you. This Sunday readings talk about Jesus' fire and the cost of living the truth of the Gospel.

already blazing!" "Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." These statements challenge our usual image of Jesus as the Prince of Peace. But let us look more deeply at the kind of fire and divisions Jesus is speaking about. In the Scripture, fire often symbolizes the presence of God, like the burning bush in Moses' story or the tongues of fire (Holy Spirit) at Pentecost. It is the fire of God's love that purifies hearts and compels us toward truth and transformation. But that kind of fire can be uncomfortable. It requires change. And not everyone wants to change. That is why Jesus says that He brings division. He is not contradicting His mission of peace but clarifying it. The peace of Christ is not synonymous with compromise or just "getting" along." It comes from living in truth, even if that truth causes tension. When we choose to truly follow Jesus, we may be misunderstood, opposed, or even alienated by others. But this division is not the goal; it is often the cost of discipleship.

In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah suffers for speaking the truth. He tells the people what they don't want to hear, and so they throw him into a cistern to die. But God rescues him. Jesus, too, speaks the truth — not to condemn, but to save. And like Jeremiah, He faces rejection, suffering, and death, but God raised Him from the dead. Living the Gospel may bring conflict or rejection even from those closest to us. The Letter to the Hebrews encourages us to "run the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of our faith." This race involves sacrifice, endurance, and courage. The saints, the "great cloud of witnesses," who lived in truth are cheering us on. Let us ask ourselves: Is the fire of Christ's love alive in me? Am I willing to live my faith and speak truth with love, even when it's unpopular? May we not be afraid of the fire Jesus brings — for it is the fire that purifies and transforms us from "frozen Christians" into missionary disciples on fire.

As the new school year begins, I want to invoke God's blessing upon all students and teachers of our parish, and welcome back St Elizabeth of the Trinity students and those who are joining us for the first time. Dear students, a new school year brings excitement, hopes, and perhaps a few worries. But it also brings a fresh opportunity to grow in knowledge and faith. I want you to know that you're not alone. God walks with you — and so do we, your parish family. Remember that success isn't just about grades; it's about growing in wisdom, responsibility, and God's love. Keep Christ at the center of your days. A short prayer in the morning, a quiet thank-you at night, and hard work can make a difference in your academic performance.

I also want to take a moment to speak directly to parents, especially to those of you who are feeling the quiet ache of letting go. I hear you. Sending your child off to school is not easy. Whether it is your child's first day of kindergarten or their last year of high school, it's never a simple routine. It is an experience of mixed emotions of pride, hope, and oftentimes tears. Let us turn to Mary, the mother of Jesus, who surely felt both joy and sorrow as she watched her Son take His first steps away from her. She knows what it means to trust, to hope, and to let go with love. May your homes remain full of love, even when they feel a little emptier as kids return to school. May God bless, protect and inspire our children as they start this new school year.

A Story of Water

Imagine waking up tomorrow with just a single bucket of clean water to share with your entire family. This bucket of clean water has been preciously stored from the previous night's ten-mile round trip trek to a water source. Think about doing this every day after you have completed your school day. Could you carry your family's daily water needs with the container balanced on your head, realizing that for half of your round trip, the bucket is full? This task is the enormous responsibility of the children in the households of Rwanda. Our own Father Deo used to make a similar trek as a child in Rwanda. Now think about going to school without having anything to drink with lunch.

This story is about to get better...One very determined Sharing Family pushed for a better way to get fresh water. With a lot of effort, the first rainwater collection tank was installed at the Station School. The students and teachers celebrated as if they received a gift from the angels in Chicago



Do You Want to Join the Catholic Church?

The **Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA)** is a process for adults, of high school age or older, who wish to enter the Catholic Church or complete their Sacraments of Initiation and is designed for the following:

- 1. Those who have never been baptized.
- 2. Those who have been baptized in another Christian faith.
- 3. Those who have been baptized Catholic but never prepared for and received First Communion and/or Confirmation.

The OCIA sessions, hosted by our sister parish St. Paul of the Cross in Park Ridge, provide opportunities for you to ask questions about the Catholic Church. You will learn what the Catholic Church believes, teaches, and proclaims as revealed by God.

The Lord awaits all of us to answer His call to a deeper relationship with Him through His Church. This is only possible if we have the Sacraments that He gave His Church.
