

# Striving to enter through the narrow gate

Dear sisters and brothers,

Peace be with you! We continue our journey through the Gospel of Luke, where Jesus, on His way to Jerusalem, offers profound teachings about the Kingdom of Heaven. In today's passage (Luke13:22-30) someone asks Him: "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" And instead of giving a direct answer, Jesus turns the question back to the crowd and to us: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." I'd like to focus my meditation on the imagery of the narrow gate and its implications for our Christian discipleship.

In today's world, we are constantly surrounded by messages that promote ease, self-interest, comfort, and compromise. We are often led to believe that life is best lived by taking the easy road—doing whatever feels good, following our own version of "truth," and building a reality shaped more by personal preference than by objective moral grounding. For many, success is measured by popularity, wealth, influence, or approval. But this mindset of seeking salvation without sacrifice resembles what may be called the "wide gate": the popular path, the path of least resistance. It demands nothing, promises everything, and appeals to comfort over conversion. But the glow of its rewards is short-lived. This can influence how we live our faith, gradually reducing it to the bare minimum. For some, life is busy and attending Sunday Mass in person has become occasional. For others, the sacramental life, especially confession, is rarely sought. Our homes may no longer be places of daily prayer. This is not a judgment, but a heartfelt concern—one that calls for sincere pastoral and spiritual discernment.

In contrast to the easy and popular path, Jesus speaks of the narrow gate—the challenging but life-giving way of authentic discipleship. When asked about how many would be saved, Jesus shifts the focus from others to a personal call to enter through the narrow gate. In fact, Christians of the first century were being persecuted, made fun of, and rejected for being followers of Christ. The evangelist Luke offers a clear and urgent warning, urging his audience to choose the path of holiness with greater urgency, sincerity, and effort: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." But what is the narrow gate?

For Pope Benedict XVI, the narrow gate is the path of truth, self-denial, humility, mercy, obedience, and love. It is the way of the cross. It's the path that refuses shortcuts, choosing the truth of the Gospel, even when it's unpopular or costly. Ultimately, the narrow gate is not a rulebook, but a Person — Jesus Christ. To enter by this gate means to live in a relationship with Him and allow that relationship to transform how we live. It is not about suffering for its own sake, but about freedom through truth and a life of deep meaning, even in difficulty. Jesus assures us that the narrow gate "is a path that leads to life, not only eternal life, but also a more meaningful and fulfilling life here and now." (Homily, WYD, August 21, 2005)

Jusus also warns us that many will try to enter but they will not be recognized and say: "We ate and drank in your company," but He will reply, "I do not know you." That's a hard truth. Being inside the church does not guarantee an entry into Heaven. Going to Mass, even knowing Scripture is important but not enough if we don't develop a personal relationship with Him. In other ways, being intentional disciples is not just about what we believe, but how we live, putting the Gospel into action — in our parish, families, workplaces, and communities. Our Catholic faith is rich not only in teachings but also in practices that deeply nourish our soul: daily prayer, Sunday Eucharist, regular confession, the Rosary, acts of charity, Scripture reading, Eucharistic Adoration, and active participation in the various ministries of the Church.

The Holy Spirit is calling each of us to be active participants, not just spectators, in our parish life. I'm available for spiritual guidance, pastoral discernment or any personal concerns. Lastly, we kicked off the new School year on Wednesday. We want our students to be grounded in Christ, with hearts open to learning, hands ready to serve, and spirits lifted in prayer. We invite you to prayerfully consider supporting the *Trinity Tuition Assistance Fund*. (See Principal Hillmann's letter on the school page of this bulletin for more information.) Your generosity ensures that no child is turned away from the blessings of faithbased learning. Please pray for our children, educators, and parents so that they may grow in wisdom and grace.



In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us to "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." Our call to be disciples and to follow Jesus demands that we learn to live for the sake of others.

Dear Friends.

As most of you know already, in spring I was diagnosed with blocked arteries to my heart. The initial remedy (insertion of stents) didn't work. The solution then, was a minimally invasive heart procedure. This occurred on July 31. Before & after the surgery, doctors guaranteed a full recovery in 1-2 months time. The surgery was a success & I am now on the mend. I was in the hospital for 11 days & have been in the rectory since then. The process of recovery & rehab has been slow & difficult at times. I'm still told, however, that I'm on schedule for a full recovery. For this I am grateful to God.

I'm also grateful to many of God's good people:

- The medical staff at Loyola University Medical Center have been skilled & compassionate through it all. Regular checkups at Loyola are a given. I have home health care coming to the Rectory now. Cardiac rehab will be the next step.
- My sister, Mary, has been an angel. A retired nurse, she has been with me every step of the way, encouraging me and challenging me to work harder in my rehab.
- Fr Deo & Fr Leo have been kind & generous with their time and energy. They're never too busy for a cheery visit. Every day I'm blessed to receive Holy Communion from either one.
- You, the people of St Elizabeth of the Trinity made my return to the Rectory last week a great joy with your abundance of cards, notes, emails and, especially the promise of your prayers. Friends from my other priestly assignments and my many cousins in Ireland have also made all of this easier with their greetings and prayers as well. I will never be able to thank you enough but please know of my gratitude and prayers.

Doctors tell me I should be ready to go by the 1<sup>st</sup> week of October. I pray they're right. Until then, please continue to pray for me. I'll keep you updated here in the bulletin. Eternally grateful,




