

FROM FR. DEO



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

This Sunday, we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, which is the very instrument of our salvation. At first glance, it may seem strange, even contradictory, to celebrate the Cross, a device once used for torture, humiliation, and execution. Why should we glorify something associated with suffering and death? And yet, the wood of the Cross stands as a paradoxical symbol of God's love and His victory over death and evil. It is the tree of life, planted in the heart of human history, bearing the fruit of salvation. To venerate the Cross is not to glorify pain but to worship the One who embraced that pain for our redemption.

Historically, this celebration originated in the fourth century. Saint Helen, mother of Constantine, miraculously discovered the Cross on September 14, 326, while on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Constantine later built the Church of the Holy Sepulchre on the site of her discovery. The liturgical veneration of the Cross has been widespread since the seventh century.

Today we adore the Cross of Christ as the universal symbol of the Christian faith. It has inspired both liturgical and personal devotions: for example, the Sign of the Cross, which is an invocation of the Holy Trinity; the "little" Sign of the Cross on head, lips, and heart at the reading of the Gospel; praying the Stations of the Cross, and the Veneration of the Cross on Good Friday.

Today's readings remind us of the significance of the Cross. The Book of Numbers tells us how the Israelites were bitten by serpents because of their sins and complaints. When they cried out for help, God told Moses to lift up a bronze serpent on a pole — and whoever looked at it was healed. Like the bronze serpent, Jesus, in the Gospel alludes to being "lifted up" not to condemn but to bring salvation and healing. The second reading (Phil 2:6-11) tells us that Jesus "humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

What does the Cross of Jesus mean for us today? First, the Cross, the symbol of God's humility, is the throne from which Jesus reigns, not in worldly power, but in sacrificial love and perfect humility. Second, the Cross is not a sign of condemnation, but a sign of mercy. The Cross tells us that no sin is too great to be forgiven. Therefore, our own crosses —our trials, wounds, and losses —have meaning when united with Christ's. To exalt the Cross means to embrace it, not run from it. Third, the story of the Cross ends with the Resurrection. The Cross, once a symbol of suffering, has become for us a sign of victory, love, hope, and eternal life.

Today, as we exalt the Holy Cross, we remember that in Christ's wounds, we find our healing; in His death, our life; and in His sacrifice, the fullest expression of God's love for the world.

In parish news, I'm delighted to invite you and your loved ones to our Parish Social Celebration next weekend. More than just an event, it is an expression of our unity as a parish family. Let's come together to rejoice in that unity, strengthen our bonds, and welcome new faces with warmth and hospitality.

In this bulletin, our Operations Director Mike Parilla, provides a summary of the projects completed and a preview of those planned in the near future. More details and financial recommendations will be shared by the Parish Finance Council. In addition, I am forming our Parish Pastoral Council, and we will soon announce the names of those who will serve.

Please consider joining us for Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday and Thursday. Come and rest in the loving presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Whether you stay for a few minutes or a full hour, this is a beautiful opportunity to find peace, listen to God's voice, and bring your prayers before Him. Lastly, I will be with you in spirit this weekend as I will do my last Mission Appeal at SS. Genevieve and Stanislaus Bishop and Martyr Parish. I will carry you in my prayers and kindly ask that you pray for the success of my mission as well.

Let us then lift high the Cross—not only in our churches and homes, but also in our hearts and lives—as a sign of hope and a call to follow Christ with courage, faith, and love.

Parish Project Updates

As we move into Fall I wanted to take a moment to recap what projects have been completed over the last year and a half, and let you know what upcoming projects will be taking place at our Parish. You likely all noticed a portion of Ardmore had been blocked off the last 3 weeks, as we completed a full tear off of the roof on 3 of the 4 main roofs which included the main school building and auditorium. Prior to that we also replaced 95% of the church roofs, including the shingled pitched roof. Early in the spring we started the full replacement of the lights in the church. We had a lengthy delay in the project as some of the fixtures we received were broken in shipping. After a 3-month delay, we have the new fixtures and expect completion of that project in the next few weeks.

Moving to the end of 2025 and into 2026 the next phase of projects we have consists of replacing the HVAC System for the church and the gym. The plan was to have this completed back in May but the unit they shipped was the wrong unit. We are hoping that we will get the new unit in the next few weeks and can get them replaced prior to winter starting. In conjunction with the HVAC replacement, we are also redoing the west Sacristy roof the unit sits on. This will bring us to 100% church roof replacement as we move into 2026. With the roofs of the church being done we are looking to have a portion of the ceiling tiles in the rear of the church replaced along with some patching and repainting of sections of the walls and ceilings by the saints and stained glass that suffered a lot of water damage over the last several years. Also, by spring of 2026 we look to replace the roof on the rectory to stop the leaking our Priests have been experiencing over the last several years.

Finally, our principal Dr. Hillmann, our Facilities Manager Mark Brun and myself have met with an architect to begin planning our new playground for the School and Parish. The plan is to turn the Moody Parking lot into a playground and green space that all of the Parish and our school kids can benefit from as a place to exercise during lunch and gather and socialize after Mass. Our goal is to have this completed by the start of school year 2026, if all falls into place perfectly.

We are excited for all we have accomplished so far over the last couple of years and we look forward to all we are going to accomplish around the Parish Campus as we move into 2026 and beyond. Thank you for your support of our Parish and continued patience as these projects do require some maneuverings and adjusting from all of us as when we come to Church and School.
