FROM FR. DEO

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

God is good all the time... All the time God is good! Today's readings tell us about the connection between discipleship and stewardship. Discipleship is following Jesus Christ and developing a relationship with Him that transforms us. Stewardship is the practical and spiritual response of a disciple. As the U.S. Bishops explain: "A Christian steward is one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, shares them in justice and love with others, and returns them with increase to the Lord."

This Sunday's readings remind us that God expects faithful and prudent stewardship. In the first reading, Amos, the prophet of social justice, condemns crooked business practices. He calls the Jewish merchants and Israelites to be faithful to Yahweh, the God of Justice. For Amos, stewardship demands the practice of justice and mercy to all.

In the second reading, St. Paul instructs Timothy and his community to become true stewards of the Gospel, by preaching the "Good News" to pagans. Today's Gospel tells the story of the dishonest steward (Luke 16:1–13). At first, we might wonder why Jesus seems to praise a man who acted dishonestly. But a closer reading shows that Jesus is challenging us to be spiritually wise and intentional in how we use the resources entrusted to us. What do these readings teach us?

1. Holiness is achieved by living our faith with honesty and being faithful in little things. Jesus invites us to be generous, share, and invest our time, money, and energy in what lasts forever such as love, mercy, justice, and the service of others.

Jesus instructs us to become "faithful in small things," St. John Chrysostom declares: "Faithfulness in little things is a big thing," and St. Theresa of Calcutta commends us: "Do little things with great love."

The message is that it is not the size of the gift that matters, but the love with which we offer it. A simple good morning, a phone call, a kindly thank you, celebrating the blessings and success of others, sharing in their sorrows, offering them help and support in their needs, inviting a friend to Mass or adoration and welcoming someone in the church – these are "little things" we can all do.

- 2.Our faith calls us today to use wisely the spiritual resources God's offers us to make every moment a step toward eternity. Our church is open every day; we have the gift of Jesus in every Mass, and on Tuesday and Thursday Jesus is waiting for us for adoration, and we have different ministries for men and women to help us grow in the knowledge of and encounter with the Lord.
- 3. Finally, Our Lord reminds us that we cannot serve two masters. As members of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish, let us grow in our trust in God and be wise stewards of what we've been given, and put our faith into action through service, prayer, and generosity.

We must use our blessings — time, talents, health and wealth – wisely and justly so that they will serve us well in eternity.

In parish news, we have created a "Parishioners' Corner" page in the bulletin -- a dedicated space for you. As members of the Body of Christ, each one of us has something valuable to contribute: a journey of faith, a moment of grace, a prayer intention, a reflection on the readings. Please share these with your fellow parishioners on the "Parishioners' Corner" page.

I'm happy to remind you that this weekend is our Parish Social! It's a wonderful opportunity for us to come together as a faith community—not just to pray, but to celebrate, connect, and enjoy one another's company.

Finally, I reiterate our invitation to join us for Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday and Thursday here in our Church. Take a break from the noise and busyness of your daily life to rest in the peaceful presence of the Lord.


We're excited to share that Faith Direct will soon be upgrading to ParishSOFT Giving—our new, secure giving platform.





Your thoughts about how our parish can go forward can be submitted in print by dropping it off or mailing it to the Rectory. If you like, you can submit your comments anonymously.






