

FROM FR. DEO





Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Today, we give thanks to God for the canonization of two beloved young laypeople who continue to inspire us with their profound examples of Christian discipleship: Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991–2006) and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901–1925). Frassati, a young lay Dominican from Turin, Italy, was known for his deep spirituality and tireless service to the poor. He lived a life rooted in prayer and charity, embodying the Gospel in every aspect of his daily routine. Acutis, a saint of our times, speaks especially to the hearts of young people. He lived a short, but radiant life and gave us a powerful and relatable wit-

ness of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ in the modern world.

As we reflect on today's readings, we're inspired by these two saints to live authentic discipleship by putting God first in our lives and carrying our cross. The first reading instructs us to ask for the gifts of discernment and strength from the Holy Spirit so that we may do the will of God as His true disciples. St. Paul's letter to Philemon reminds us that detachment and renunciation are necessary for a true disciple of Christ. Jesus takes up Paul's point by articulating the cost of discipleship. He makes it clear that "Whoever does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple." He uses two images to highlight the cost of discipleship: a man building a tower who first calculates the cost, and a king going to war who evaluates his army. Following Christ may cost us our time, our priorities, even our comforts and attachments. But it will set us free and lead us to a happy and purposeful life despite the suffering we may experience. Acutis, even in his final days when he was dying of leukemia, offered his suffering with joy and for others. He never complained. He said: "I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church." Acutis teaches us that discipleship involves sacrificial love and trusting God even in pain.

In our consumer society, Jesus invites us to renounce possessions: "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." This spiritual detachment requires sharing what we have with others and seeing God and others as our treasure. Acutis understood Jesus' teaching and said: "I am happy to die because I have lived my life without wasting a minute on those things which do not please God" and "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan." Acutis was a normal teenager who played soccer, loved computers, and enjoyed video games. But he lived his faith authentically every day, showing kindness, standing up for bullied classmates, and helping the poor. Acutis used his tech skills to build a website proclaiming the faith-inspiring Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He challenges modern disciples, especially young people, to use social media and the Internet to evangelize. He centered his life on the Eucharist, attending daily Mass and Eucharistic Adoration: "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven." His deep devotion to the Eucharist teaches us that discipleship is nourished by the Real Presence of Christ. His life reminds us that holiness is possible at any age and in any generation.

What could these readings and two young saints teach us about our discipleship and parish life? For many people, it's easy to fall into the habit of being "parishioners," people who attend Mass occasionally and support the Church. But the Gospel calls us to something deeper, more intentional, and more transformative. Jesus did not say, "Come, be a parishioner." He said: "Come, follow me" (Matthew 4:19). The Church exists not just to gather people, but to form disciples, people who know Jesus personally, follow Him daily, and share His mission in the world. As a community of disciples, we must bear witness to our Lord by participating as active members – not spectators – in the life and ministries of our parish. Transformed into disciples, parishioners do not just go to church; they understand that they are the Church; they live, act, and walk together, each one discerning what they can do for and as a Church. As we celebrate the lives of these new saints, may we be inspired to live out our own discipleship with renewed zeal, joyful hearts, and compassionate service.

This Sunday we officially begin our Religious Education Program. I want to express my deep gratitude to our catechists and volunteers who generously devote their time to this ministry. Their dedication and witness are essential to the spiritual growth of our young parishioners. I warmly invite all families to register their children for Religious Education and to make it a priority in the coming year.


