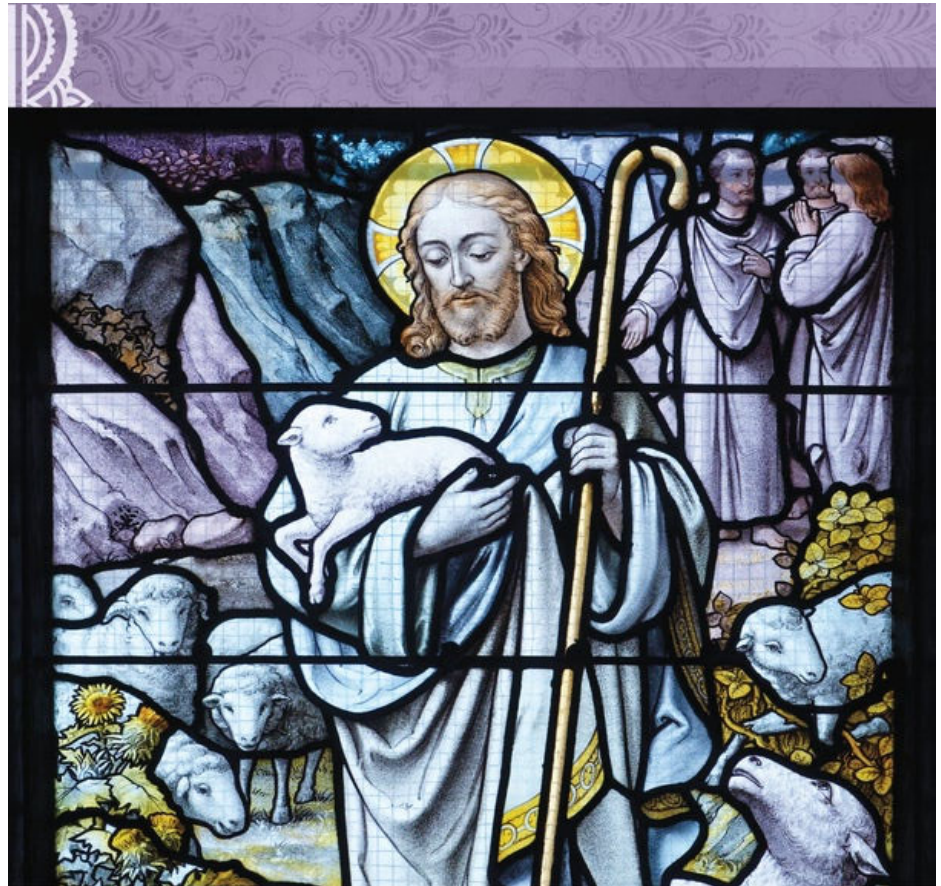

FROM FR. DEO

Dear brothers and Sisters,
He is truly risen! Alleluia!

This Fourth Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday, is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The Church invites us to reflect on God's call and to pray for those discerning a life of service in the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life. The Good Shepherd continues His work through those He calls, reminding each of us to listen to His voice, and to follow Him.

Today's Gospel (John 10:1–10) describes the Good Shepherd who lovingly cares for His flock. John gives us two powerful images: Jesus is the Shepherd and the Gate. As the Good Shepherd, He knows His sheep and calls each by name (John 10:3). We are not numbers to Him—each of us is personally known, loved, and called by name. At the same time, Jesus is the Gate. Through Him we are led to life and salvation. He does not only guide us to eternal life—He is Himself the way into it.

Christian discipleship means following Christ—trusting Him and allowing His voice to shape our lives, even when the path is unclear. The challenge is to recognize His voice, which often comes through others. As St. Óscar Romero said, “Each one of you has to be God's microphone... a messenger, a prophet.” This is the witness Christ asks of all who are called to shepherd others.

Following His example, we are all called to be good shepherds—leading, nurturing, comforting, correcting, and protecting those entrusted to us. This mission belongs not only to Church leaders, but also to parents, civic leaders, and all who have responsibility for others.

Join me in honoring our first responders at the 9:00 Mass today—firefighters, police officers, and paramedics who respond in moments of crisis. Like the Good Shepherd, they run toward danger, risking their lives to protect and save others while others are running away.

Thanks to those who have contributed reflections, personal stories and individual perspectives to our “Parishioners' Corner” page. Each article has been uniquely valuable. If you have not contributed to this forum, I invite you to share your thoughts and faith experiences with our parish community.

In parish news, you are warmly invited to a Candlelight Rosary to begin the month of Mary and honor mothers and grandmothers. Together, we will pray for all mothers—those with us, those who have gone before us, and those who nurture life with love. We are also organizing a Mother's Day raffle to support our parish ministries. See page 10 of this bulletin.

Next Saturday, our children will receive Communion for the first time. In the Eucharist, they will receive Jesus, who truly loves them and draws close as their friend and guide. Let us support them by our example of faith, prayer, and love, and may this moment renew in all of us a deeper love for the Eucharist.

May we grow in our ability to recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd, trust in His care, and follow Him more faithfully each day.

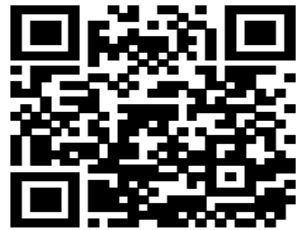

WHAT IS TOTUS TUUS?

Totus Tuus is a week-long, summer youth retreat for young people in first through 12th grade. Participants will grow in their faith through skits, games, songs, the celebration of the sacraments, and engaging, interactive teaching. Hosted at 22 parishes, a Totus Tuus team of four college students and seminarians will inspire our young people with their energy and enthusiasm for the Catholic faith. They bring to our parish a zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and a missionary spirit. Their joy is contagious and will remind us that Jesus “came that we might have life and have it more abundantly” (Jn. 10:10).

The Totus Tuus program is built upon five pillars: love for the Eucharist, Marian devotion, authentic catechesis, Christian vocations, and fun! Our hope is to deepen the relationship our young people have with the Lord Jesus, while showing them how exciting a lifetime adventure with the Lord can be.

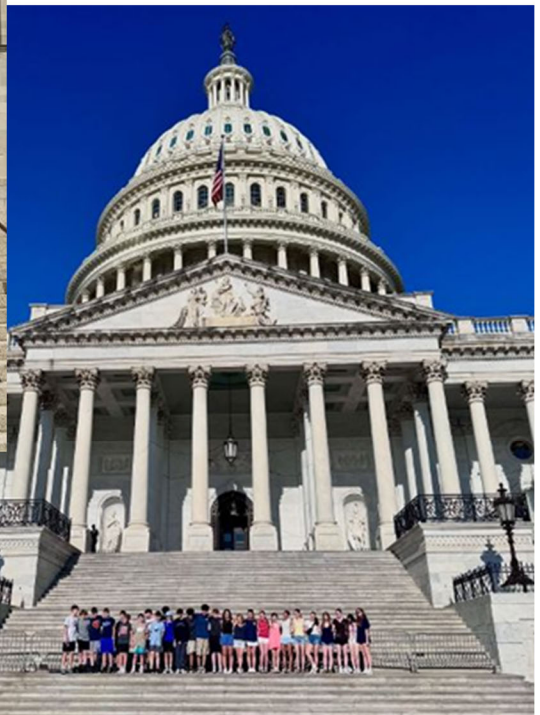
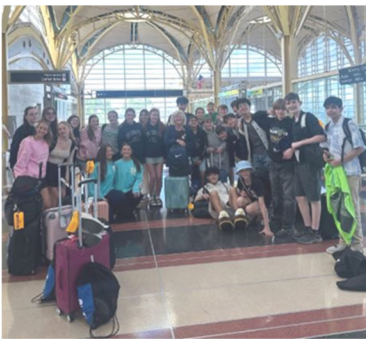

An Invitation to Eucharistic Adoration

Over the years in my different parishes, I have always tried to be of service. It's a parish family, after all. I am a lector, like my dad was, and previously I helped with Religious Education, just like my mom. I've also been a Minister of Care to the homebound and participated in various special liturgies and parish activities.

Currently, I assist my husband, Brian, with the parish contemporary music group, and I coordinate Eucharistic Adoration scheduling. I would like to share my thoughts about Eucharistic Adoration, especially with those who might be hesitant to stop by for a visit.

I believe it is a blessing to spend time with Jesus! There's nothing you need to know other than Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist FOR US. On busy days, sometimes it's hard to stay awake...but, hey, Peter, James, and John had that problem, too.

There doesn't have to be anything fancy about Eucharistic Adoration. You can read with Him or pour out your troubles. As the Psalm beautifully says, "Be still and know that I am God." I invite you to try Eucharistic Adoration!

Here is the schedule for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity:

Tuesday: 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (Benediction at 6:00 p.m.)

Thursday: From after the 8:30 a.m. Mass until Benediction at 6:50 p.m. (in Spanish)

Stop in at any time...for any length of time that fits your schedule.

A little bit of Catholic Church history – Eucharistic Adoration was solidly established by the beginning of the Middle Ages. St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) contributed further by composing such well-known hymns that give honor to the Lord in the Eucharist and to the Holy Trinity, such as "O Salutaris Hostia" ("O Saving Victim") and "Tantum Ergo Sacramentum" ("Down in Adoration Falling"). After the Second Vatican Council (which concluded in 1965), the number of parishes offering Eucharistic Adoration declined. However, St. John Paul II strongly encouraged rediscovering the treasure of Eucharistic Adoration, declaring that the Blessed Sacrament was an "inexhaustible source of holiness." St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Parish is among the many parishes that have responded.
