Pentecost Sunday



Peace to you! This Sunday, we celebrate with the whole Church the Solemnity of Pentecost, the moment on which the promised Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary. The book of the Acts of the Apostles recounts that “They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the spirit enabled them to proclaim.” This description is most powerful and pivotal for the life of the nascent Church.

For the Apostles, who had once been overcome with fear and trembling, who had been hiding away behind closed doors, sprang into evangelizing action! The Spirit promised by Jesus before His Ascension prompted them to proclaim the Good News now without any fear or reservation.

Celebrating, thus, the coming of the Holy Spirit reminds us and emboldens us to do exactly the same: to allow the Spirit of God to move us into concrete evangelizing action. After all, through our baptism and confirmation, we have received the very Spirit that the Apostles and Mary experienced that day. Our words and actions in our daily lives should thusly flow from the abundance of this Spirit that lives within. We are called and prompted to manifest our Spirit-given gifts for the good of others and the flourishing of our community. So, it is fitting to ask ourselves: What is the Holy Spirit prompting me to do? How is the Spirit, giver of life, calling me to build up the Church and serve others?

In a special way this weekend, as a parish community, we invoke the Holy Spirit upon all those who participate in one or more ministries in our parish. We are deeply grateful for the many parishioners who give of their time, talent and love in service to the community. Whether through liturgical ministries, hospitality, catechesis, music, outreach, parish organizations or behind-the-scenes service your commitment to ministering is a true blessing to our parish family. Thank you for sharing so much with us through your generous service!

One beautiful example has been our new Children’s Liturgy of the Word ministry. It has been inspiring to see the little ones of our parish joyfully learning about God’s Word in a way they can understand and embrace. Seeing our little children spring up from their families in the pews to listen to the Word reminds us how the Holy Spirit continues to renew and strengthen the life of His Church.

To this end, at all Masses this weekend, a special blessing will be given after the Homily for all those involved in ministry. We also continue to encourage anyone who may be discerning greater involvement in parish life to consider joining one or more ministries. The Holy Spirit grants gifts to each person for a reason, and our parish is vivified when those gifts are shared.

Finally, as we observe Memorial Day weekend, we remember and pray in gratitude for all the men and women who gave their lives in service to our nation. We especially remember the fallen heroes from our neighborhood and parish community. May the Lord grant them eternal rest, and may the Holy Spirit continue to guide us in the ways of peace and selfless love.

Parishioners' Corner



Pentecost 2026: How is the Holy Spirit calling you to renew the face of our Church?

Today, the Church globally celebrates Pentecost. Think about that – 20 (and 1/4) centuries since the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, just as Jesus promised. And that started His church!

I am particularly fond of this liturgical season as the stories of conversion and miracles unfold in the Acts of

the Apostles – 3,000 people converted in one day! For me, this year's celebration is especially significant. I am writing this reflection from Istanbul, formerly Constantinople, during a trip with friends to Turkey. To walk in the footsteps of the saints and martyrs of the Early Church is humbling. To reflect on how God continues to guide His Church, and is working within, St. Elizabeth of the Trinity – is even more humbling.

“Church” is not a building, or a hierarchy of parishes in a diocese, centralized under papal authority. The “church” is the *people* of God, as One Body in Christ. *We are the Church. You, me, the babies being baptized, those who joined the Church on Easter Sunday.*

The “mystery of the Church” is explained in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, Part 1, Article 9, #770. Read it sometime and let me know if it inspires you like it has me.

This mystery became more real for me during our visit to Hagia Sophia, the once-majestic basilica opened in 537 AD. It was the most significant religious center of the Byzantine Empire and the scene of coronations. But the building and contents suffered from looting, fire, and earthquakes over the centuries.

During the Ottomans' siege of Istanbul in 1453, Sultan Mehmed II, recognizing the crumbling church as a place of worship, began its conversion to a mosque. The name, Hagia Sophia, which means Holy Wisdom, was retained, a recognition of the ecumenical nature of the Holy Spirit by both Christians and Muslims.

During the refurbishing, the dazzling mosaics and frescoes depicting important Christian images were covered in plaster, in preparation for Islamic artwork. Today the building is more of a museum and work is underway to uncover the Christian artwork that is under the plaster.

During the tour, I was moved by how the beauty and the mystery of our faith transcended time. And it struck me – just as the once-magnificent Hagia Sophia lost its glory and was no longer a place of worship and celebration of the Eucharist, my beloved St. Cornelius church suffered a similar fate. I am not comparing the midcentury-style architecture of the church on Foster Avenue to the grandeur of Hagia Sophia – just that the church where my son received his First Communion and I began my ministry as a catechist is now home to a pickleball club.

But what has not changed, is the most important part of the Church – the people of God. We are the Church. And “Holy Wisdom” is alive in the people of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity. In the words of Cardinal Suenens, “...believe in the surprises of the Holy Spirit. The story of the Church is, filled with the wonders of the Holy Spirit. Why should we think that God's imagination and love might be exhausted?” This Pentecost, consider what the Spirit is inviting you to do in our church. Come, be a part of something greater.
