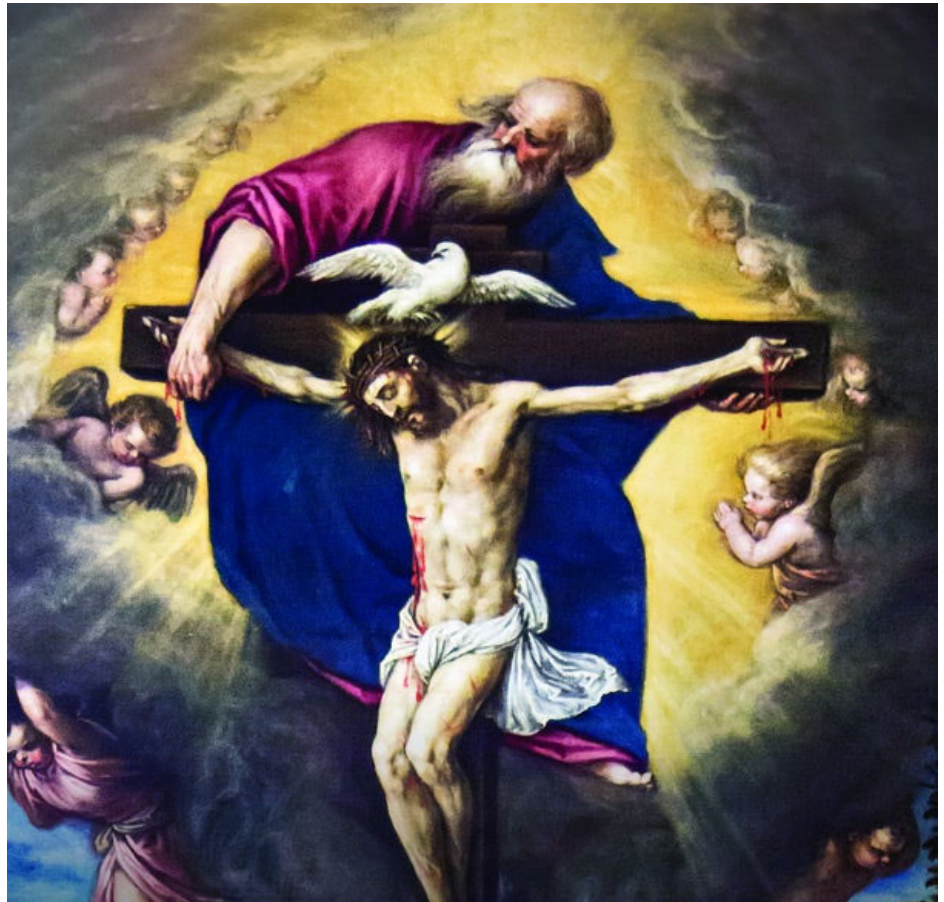

## Trinity Sunday



Peace to you! As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity this Sunday, the Gospel gives us one of the most beloved and profound passages in the whole of the Scriptures: “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.” In just a few words, Jesus reveals to us the heart of God. That is, that the Father gives the Son out of love for the world, and that this Son comes into the heart of humanity with the sole purpose of saving us. The third divine person, the Holy Spirit, whom the Son clearly promised throughout the Gospel, draws us into this divine life and teaches us how to live in that same love.

The Holy Trinity is thus a lot more than just a mysterious reality beyond our grasp or reach. The Trinity is a communion of persons united in perfect love. Throughout the Easter Season readings, especially in the Gospel selections from John, Jesus tells us what He has heard from the Father for a very specific reason: both Father and Son live in a perfect communion. Nothing remains hidden between them. God the Father has revealed everything to His Son. Thus, the love that exists between them is never concentrated in one or the other, but eternally shared and given.

This mystery, by extension, reveals to us something very important about our lives. We were created in the image and likeness of this Triune God, who lives in communion. We are thus not meant to live alone or disconnected from one another. Every family, group of friends, and parish community is called, if not urged, to reflect the loving communion and unity of the Trinity. Whenever we participate in service or in the charitable action of forgiveness or mutual encouragement, we participate in the life of the Three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

This weekend, we also congratulate our graduating class of 2026. We will celebrate the graduation of our eighth graders tomorrow Monday, June 1<sup>st</sup> with a graduation Mass at 6:00 p.m. We give thanks to God for all their academic, spiritual, and extracurricular accomplishments. These accomplishments have enriched their lives and have prepared them for their high school journey ahead. May Christ, who is our light, be ever their guide and illumine their path forward.

Finally, just a joyful reminder to all our parishioners that next Sunday, June 7<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate our Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession. All are warmly invited to attend the 11:00 a.m. bilingual Mass and participate in the procession immediately afterward, as we publicly witness to our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Following the procession, we invite the entire parish community to stay for a parish-wide potluck in the auditorium. We encourage everyone to bring a dish, dessert, or beverage to share. Please sign up on the sheet located in the vestibule or using the link sent via Flocknote so we can prepare accordingly.

May this celebration of the Holy Trinity draw all of us ever more deeply into the communion of love that is God Himself.

## WHAT IS TOTUS TUUS?

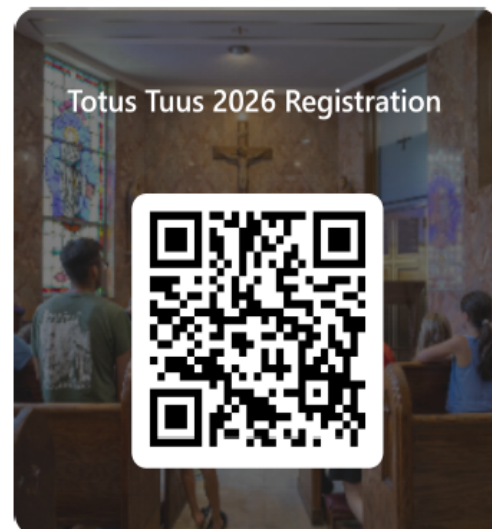
Totus Tuus is a week-long, summer youth retreat for young people in first through 12th grade. Participants will grow in their faith through skits, games, songs, the celebration of the sacraments, and engaging, interactive teaching. Hosted at 22 parishes, a Totus Tuus team of four college students and seminarians will inspire our young people with their energy and enthusiasm for the Catholic faith. They bring to our parish a zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and a missionary spirit. Their joy is contagious and will remind us that Jesus “came that we might have life and have it more abundantly” (Jn. 10:10).

The Totus Tuus program is built upon five pillars: love for the Eucharist, Marian devotion, authentic catechesis, Christian vocations, and fun! Our hope is to deepen the relationship our young people have with the Lord Jesus, while showing them how exciting a lifetime adventure with the Lord can be.

## Parishioners' Corner

Here's how it all began. I was 17 when I sought to find out more about my Catholic faith. My siblings and I had been baptized as infants. My sister made her First Communion, but I never was offered the Sacraments or any education in the faith. I knew I was Catholic, but I didn't know anything about it. My parents were too busy raising a family and paying the bills. My mother once told me: "I can't help you because all my prayers are in Polish." My mother went to Church every Sunday and I often went with her, but I didn't know what was happening.

When I was 17, I saw a big ad: *"If you want to know more about the Catholic faith..."* in a secular newspaper. Something prompted me, and I enrolled. We went back and forth by mail until they said they could not help me anymore, and that I should go to my Catholic priest.

That's what I did. I walked to the rectory for regular lessons. I found out that it was a mortal sin to miss Sunday Mass. Before long, I was ready to make my First Communion. One Sunday, I was with my mother and she asked a woman in church to be my sponsor for Confirmation, and she said "yes." So, I was confirmed. This same priest said my wedding Mass at a parish in Wicker Park.

I became a real believer and met Maureen, who became my longtime friend. She was a wonderful example of a Christian woman – always kind and giving, and I wanted to be like that. She had nine children and I had four boys. She never yelled at the kids. She was so lovely and still is.

My husband and I joined the Christian Family Movement at our local parish. We helped people find jobs, and I got my doctor involved. People didn't always have to pay him. A priest would come to the house where we would meet every two weeks. We met people from other countries--all different colors. Soon, they voted my husband and myself to lead the group.

We moved into St. Cornelius parish and became involved in school sports teams and the Holy Name Society. My husband saved the Holy Name from being disbanded because there was no interest or leadership. My husband stepped up to be President and asked people to join. It worked out pretty well. One event we planned together was a Moonlight Sonata Night with candles and tables for two for married couples. Then, I became an extraordinary minister of Communion.

Also, I enjoyed Bible study classes offered at the parish. You can never know too much about the Church and its development. I had a lot to catch up on--2,000 years!

I am a newbie and I always will be. Now, I talk to Jesus like He is my best friend.

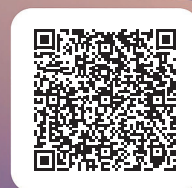

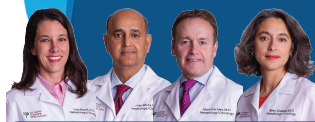

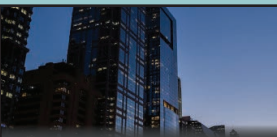
