A Father's Mission: Called to Courage, Guided by Love

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

God is good all the time... All the time God is good!

Today we celebrate the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, and the Gospel beautifully complements our celebration of Father's Day. As Jesus sends the Twelve on their mission, He warns them of the trials they will face, yet repeatedly encourages them: "Do not be afraid" (Mt 10:28). These words are meant for us as well. In a world filled with uncertainty and anxiety,

Christ reminds us that we are deeply known and loved by God: "Even all the hairs of your head are counted."

Many people worry about their families, their health, their future, and the state of the world. Fear can easily take hold of our hearts. Yet Jesus does not promise a life without trials. Instead, He assures us of God's constant presence. Jeremiah trusted the Lord despite persecution, and St. Paul reminds us that Christ's grace is greater than sin and death. Through His death and resurrection, Jesus has already won the victory for us.

This is an inspiring message for our fathers and father figures. Fathers are often called to be sources of strength, protection, guidance, and encouragement for their families. Yet fathers, too, face fears and challenges as they strive to provide and care for those entrusted to them. The example of a good father reflects something of God's own fatherly love: a love that protects, sacrifices, forgives, and remains faithful. Whether as fathers, grandfathers, spiritual fathers, or mentors, men are called to witness to God's care through their daily acts of love and humble service.

Happy Father's Day to all our fathers and father figures! Thank you for your love, sacrifice, and faithful example. May God bless you with love, wisdom, and faith as you continue to reflect His fatherly love in your families and our community.

In parish news, thank you for your prayers during our clergy convocation. We are especially grateful to our deacons for leading the services in our absence. It was a grace-filled time of prayer, fellowship, and renewed commitment to serving the People of God.

We are blessed to welcome two bishops from Rwanda this summer. Bishop John Bosco of the Diocese of Butare will visit June 26 - 30 on June 28th and celebrate the 11:00 a.m. Mass to thank our Station School sponsors and greet the community. My bishop, Bishop Balthazar Ntivuguruzwa of the Diocese of Kabgayi, will be with us July 1 -16 and will celebrate Masses on July 5 to greet our parish community.

Finally, heartfelt thanks to the Guitar Ensemble for sharing their beautiful musical gifts with our parish. We are also grateful to everyone who attended and supported the concert, making it a joyful and prayerful celebration.

WHAT IS TOTUS TUUS?

Totus Tuus is a week-long, summer youth retreat for young people in first through 12th grade. Participants will grow in their faith through skits, games, songs, the celebration of the sacraments, and engaging, interactive teaching. Hosted at 22 parishes, a Totus Tuus team of four college students and seminarians will inspire our young people with their energy and enthusiasm for the Catholic faith. They bring to our parish a zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and a missionary spirit. Their joy is contagious and will remind us that Jesus "came that we might have life and have it more abundantly" (Jn. 10:10).

The Totus Tuus program is built upon five pillars: love for the Eucharist, Marian devotion, authentic catechesis, Christian vocations, and fun! Our hope is to deepen the relationship our young people have with the Lord Jesus, while showing them how exciting a lifetime adventure with the Lord can be.

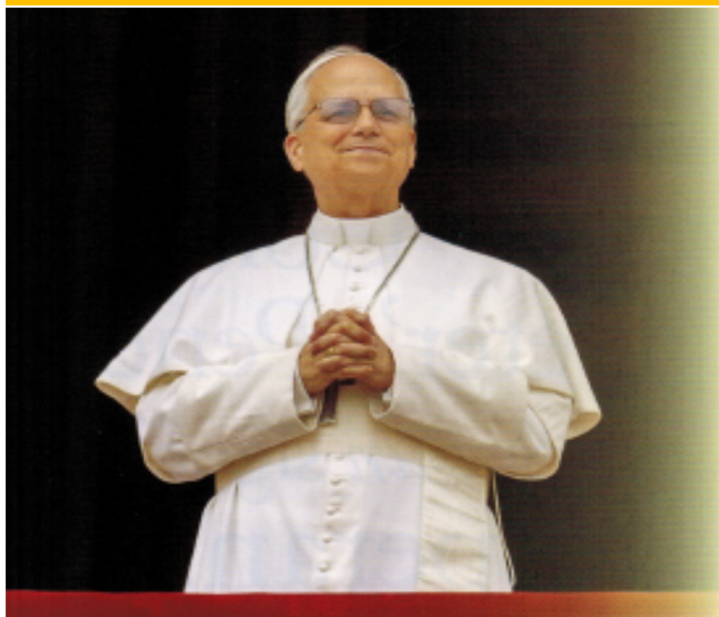

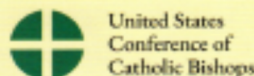

The Power of Three

On a recent trip to Rwanda, Africa (as we know, the homeland of Father Deo) I and my travelling companions made a pilgrimage visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Kibeho. This was unusual for me for two reasons. The first is that I normally travel alone. The second is that I typically spend two days at our Station School followed by a brief visit with our High School and university scholarship winners. Then, on my third night there, I promptly return home. On this trip, however, I traveled with friends and our time at the Shrine allowed for reflection and suspended presence.

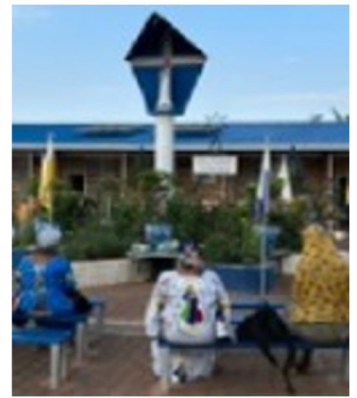
Our Lady of Kibeho is the only Vatican-approved Marian apparition on the African continent, which occurred in Rwanda between 1981 and 1989. The Virgin Mary appeared to three local girls, identifying herself as "Nyina wa Jambo" (Mother of the Word) and delivered urgent messages. Individually, these girls were not believed to be credible. Collectively, however, there could be no earthly explanation for all that unfolded and was witnessed by countless individuals. The meaningful point is that it took three girls to validate Mary's appearance.

This incredible story and holy place naturally had me deep in prayer to Mother Mary and in awe of her unconditional faith. Mother Mary's message to the three girls at Kibeho called for three actions: (1) repentance and conversion; (2) frequent prayer, especially the rosary, and (3) offering suffering to God.

The number three is personally relevant to me. First, through my personal visits to Rwanda, I have seen the fruits of the merger of our three parishes into St. Elizabeth of the Trinity, namely, that our Station School project continues to thrive. This is confirmed by the 1,623 current students (plus hundreds of postgraduates) who believe there are "angels" (that's their name for those who support the School) living here in Chicago.

Secondly, we are celebrating the arrival of our St. Elizabeth of the Trinity image. And, finally, the Trinity, as we Catholics believe, is the most holy and powerful expression of "three." Because of all of this, I feel privileged to be a part of our beautiful parish community. The powerful connection in all these instances is the three.

Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33

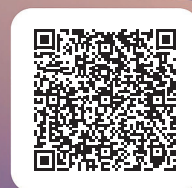
