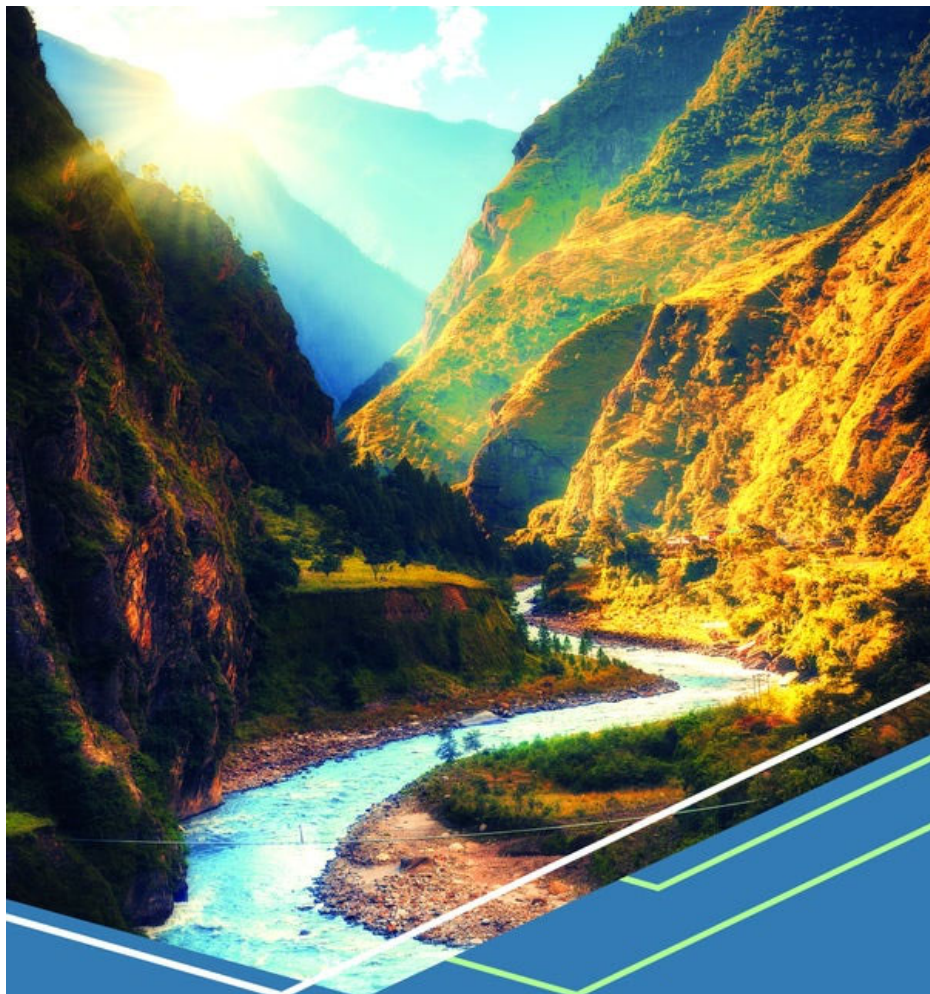

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

God is good all the time... All the time God is good!

This Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time highlights the virtue of hospitality. In the Bible, hospitality is more than being friendly or welcoming guests into our homes or our parish; it is about opening our hearts to God by welcoming others, especially those who may challenge our comfort, or need our care.

The first reading (2Kgs 4:8-11;14-16a) presents the woman of Shunem, who recognized Elisha as a holy man of God and generously welcomed him into her home. Without expecting anything in return, she made room for God's servant, and God blessed her with the son she had long desired. Her story reminds us that when we welcome in the other, God blesses us in unexpected ways.

In the Gospel (Mt 11:40) Jesus deepens this lesson: "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me." Every human encounter becomes an opportunity to welcome Christ. Christian hospitality goes beyond kindness—we welcome others not because they can repay us, but because Christ comes to us through them.

That kind of radical hospitality is love put into action. Jesus reminds us that even a cup of cold water offered in His name has eternal value. At the same time, He calls us to put Him first and love Him with our whole heart. When Christ is at the center of our lives, we are able to love others more deeply, generously, and faithfully. Loving Christ above all else does not diminish our love for our families; rather, it enriches and strengthens every relationship, because our words, actions, and decisions are shaped by His love.

The Eucharistic celebration is God's greatest act of hospitality. At His table, Christ welcomes us, feeds us, and sends us forth to become His welcoming presence in the world. A parish that practices radical hospitality doesn't simply have friendly people—it becomes a home where everyone can encounter Jesus. May everyone who enters our church doors experience the welcoming love of Jesus Christ.

In parish news, please join me in wishing Fr. Daniel McCarthy a very happy 85th birthday on July 1! Over the years, Fr. Dan has touched countless lives as a spiritual father, faithful priest, wise mentor, and a cherished pillar of our parish community. Let us keep him in our prayers and thank God for his many years of dedicated priestly ministry. Everyone is warmly invited to join us on Wednesday, July 1, at 6:00 p.m. in the parish auditorium to share dessert, fellowship, and your birthday wishes as we celebrate this special milestone with Fr. 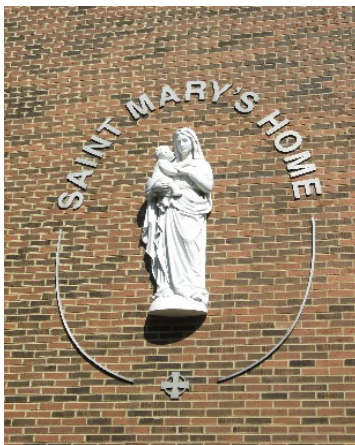

On the weekend of **July 18 and 19**, the Little Sisters of the Poor will visit our Parish to share their vocation of hospitality to the elderly. St. Mary's Home in Chicago is one of 155 Homes for the elderly poor operated by the Little Sisters in 31 countries around the world.

Acute and considerable continues to be their need for financial support. Virtually all of the current Residents of St. Mary's Home qualify for Medicaid, and a few receive meager pensions. Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I write to share information on our local Church. First, we have an update on the progress of our lawsuit against participants in a scheme to profit from false claims of abuse. These individuals sought to take advantage of the Archdiocese's pastoral response to claims, which is to trust claimants, settle cases with compassion, and support survivors of abuse in their healing. Recently, in a positive development, a judge ruled against efforts to dismiss our case. We are determined to press ahead with our defense against these false claims and the affront they represent to true survivors.

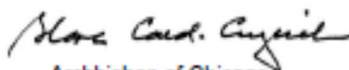
I am deeply sorry for every incident of abuse and the lifelong, often silent suffering that results. As painful as this history is, the only way to address it is with transparency and compassion for those truly harmed and an unwavering commitment to our preventive safe environment programs.

Still, over the past 18 months, we have seen a significant change in the legal environment, including widespread attorney advertising and an inflow of private equity financing supporting the law firms soliciting and bringing claims. This has resulted in an unprecedented and marked rise in the number of abuse claims, largely stemming from events alleged to have occurred decades ago. While we have compensated survivors with more than \$400 million over four decades, this development risks undermining our ability to provide a just and equitable resolution of genuine claims and increases the likelihood of more false claims.

I have other news that should bring joy to all. There is truly something unique about our current times. Across the Archdiocese and, indeed in the larger Church, more people are seeking purpose and meaning in their lives and, many for the first time, are finding it in relationship with God and His Church. This past Easter season, we saw a 50 percent increase in adults receiving their first sacraments. They were greeted with a sincere welcome and a promise to accompany them as they continue their faith journey. We are grateful for the inspiration provided by the Holy Father, our Chicago Pope Leo XIV, as we experience and rejoice in this heartening momentum.

The Church – each of us working together as the Body of Christ – is here to help heal the wounds of the past, to minister to the needs of people today and to provide hope for the future. We do this prayerfully through our parishes, schools, works of charity, and personal witness in our daily lives. I am deeply grateful for your support of the mission we share, to bring Christ's love to the world.

The Power of Three, part 2 ***The Rosary of the Seven Sorrows***

If you read my article last weekend that included a personal reflection about my visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Kibeho in Rwanda – and then did a bit of research – you know about the “Rosary of the Seven Sorrows.”

This somber devotion was taught by the Blessed Mother, beginning in 1982, to Marie-Claire Mukangango, the third of the three seers at this Vatican-approved apparition. The focus of the meditations of the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows are the sufferings that Mary went through during her earthly life. This Rosary is dedicated to the consolation of the Blessed Mother and helps us reflect on how suffering is a part of our lives as we each carry our crosses. Marie-Claire obeyed Mary’s request to spread the word about this Rosary, and this young woman steadfastly proclaimed the Blessed Mother’s urgent call for sincere repentance.

This Rosary has a rich history. One source was St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) who invited the faithful to unite their sufferings to Mary’s and to pray for strength. Then in the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries, the Servite Order embraced this special chaplet, which offers prayers of consolation to the Blessed Mother and petitions her for help in accepting our sufferings.

The mysteries of the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows are:

- The Prophecy of Simeon (“a sword will pierce your heart”)
- The Flight into Egypt
- The Loss of Jesus in the Temple
- Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Cavalry
- The Crucifixion and death of Jesus
- Mary Receives the Dead Body of Jesus in Her Arms
- Jesus is Placed in the Tomb

The beads of the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows - consisting of seven groups of seven beads separated by a small medal depicting each of the mysteries - is often made of black wood befitting the mournful themes of this devotion.

The Blessed Mother emphasized to Marie-Clarie that the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows does not replace the traditional rosary. Rather, with its simple elegance, the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows enhances our understanding of Mary’s role in our salvation and draws us nearer to her motherly care. Furthermore, she gave the rosary to the visionaries as a spiritual weapon against the abyss of evil, suffering, and sin.

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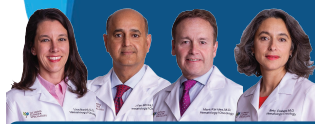
