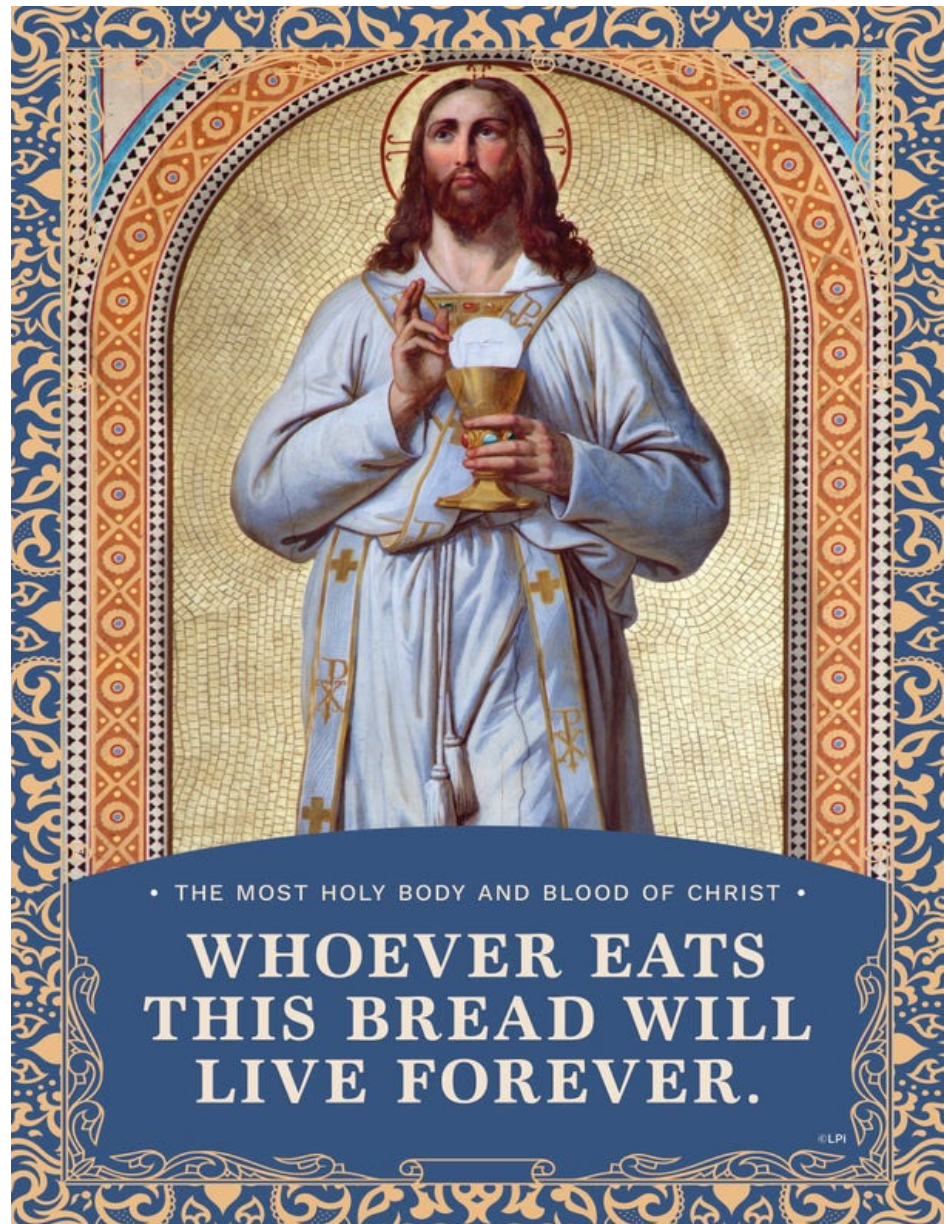

FROM FR. DEO

June 7, 2026



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Good is good all the time... all the time God is good!

I am happy to be back home. My time away was filled with blessings—reconnecting with family, friends, and fellow priests, visiting a safari park, and praying at the Shrine of Our Lady of Kibeho. Thank you for your prayers and concern, especially regarding the Ebola outbreak. I missed you all and am glad to return refreshed and renewed. I look forward to sharing some pictures with you soon!

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—Corpus Christi. This feast draws us to the very heart of our Catholic faith: the Eucharist, the Real Presence of Jesus Christ—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—under the appearances of bread and wine.

Corpus Christi has always been one of my favorite feasts since childhood. As school kids, we would gather flower petals—lavender, jasmine, and marigold—and bring them to the parish for the procession. I have always been inspired by the faith and reverence shown to our Eucharistic Lord during the procession. I invite you to join us for our Corpus Christi Procession following the 11:00 a.m. bilingual Mass, followed by a parish-wide potluck in the auditorium.

In the Eucharist, Jesus reveals the depth of His love by offering Himself to us: “Whoever eats this bread will live forever” (Jn 6:58). As St. Augustine reminds us, “When Christ is eaten, life is eaten.” The Eucharist is not merely a symbol or a memory, but Jesus Himself—the Bread of Life, who walked the shores of Galilee, died on the Cross, and rose from the tomb.

In response to this great mystery of love, we bow in adoration and lift our voices in praise by singing: “O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine.” Today, we gather for Mass, listen to and receive Him with humility. We genuflect before the tabernacle and adore Him with reverence because He is truly present among us. May our hunger for Him deepen, and may we become eucharistic people—living tabernacles—carrying His presence into our families, workplaces, and the world.

In Parish News, Congratulations to the Class of 2026 on their wonderful achievement! I wish them and our school community a joyful, and restful summer. Remember that summer is not a vacation from God. Stay close to Him through prayer, Sunday Mass, and acts of love and service.

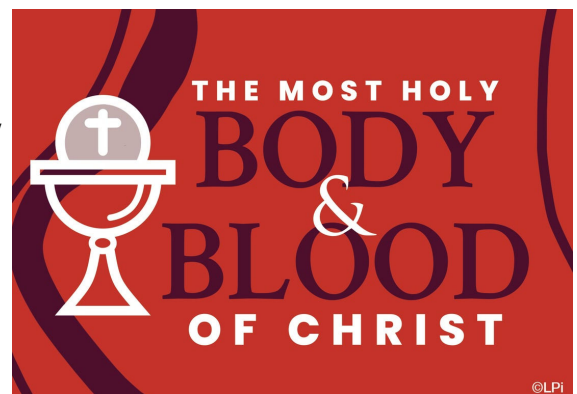

WHAT IS TOTUS TUUS?

Totus Tuus is a week-long, summer youth retreat for young people in first through 12th grade. Participants will grow in their faith through skits, games, songs, the celebration of the sacraments, and engaging, interactive teaching. Hosted at 22 parishes, a Totus Tuus team of four college students and seminarians will inspire our young people with their energy and enthusiasm for the Catholic faith. They bring to our parish a zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and a missionary spirit. Their joy is contagious and will remind us that Jesus “came that we might have life and have it more abundantly” (Jn. 10:10).

The Totus Tuus program is built upon five pillars: love for the Eucharist, Marian devotion, authentic catechesis, Christian vocations, and fun! Our hope is to deepen the relationship our young people have with the Lord Jesus, while showing them how exciting a lifetime adventure with the Lord can be.

Hope for a Nation

The Sacred Heart of Jesus

In June 2026, the Catholic bishops of the United States will take part in a profound spiritual act: the consecration of our nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Timed to coincide with the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart and the 250th anniversary of our country's founding, this moment invites Catholics across the nation to reflect on who we are—and to whom we belong.

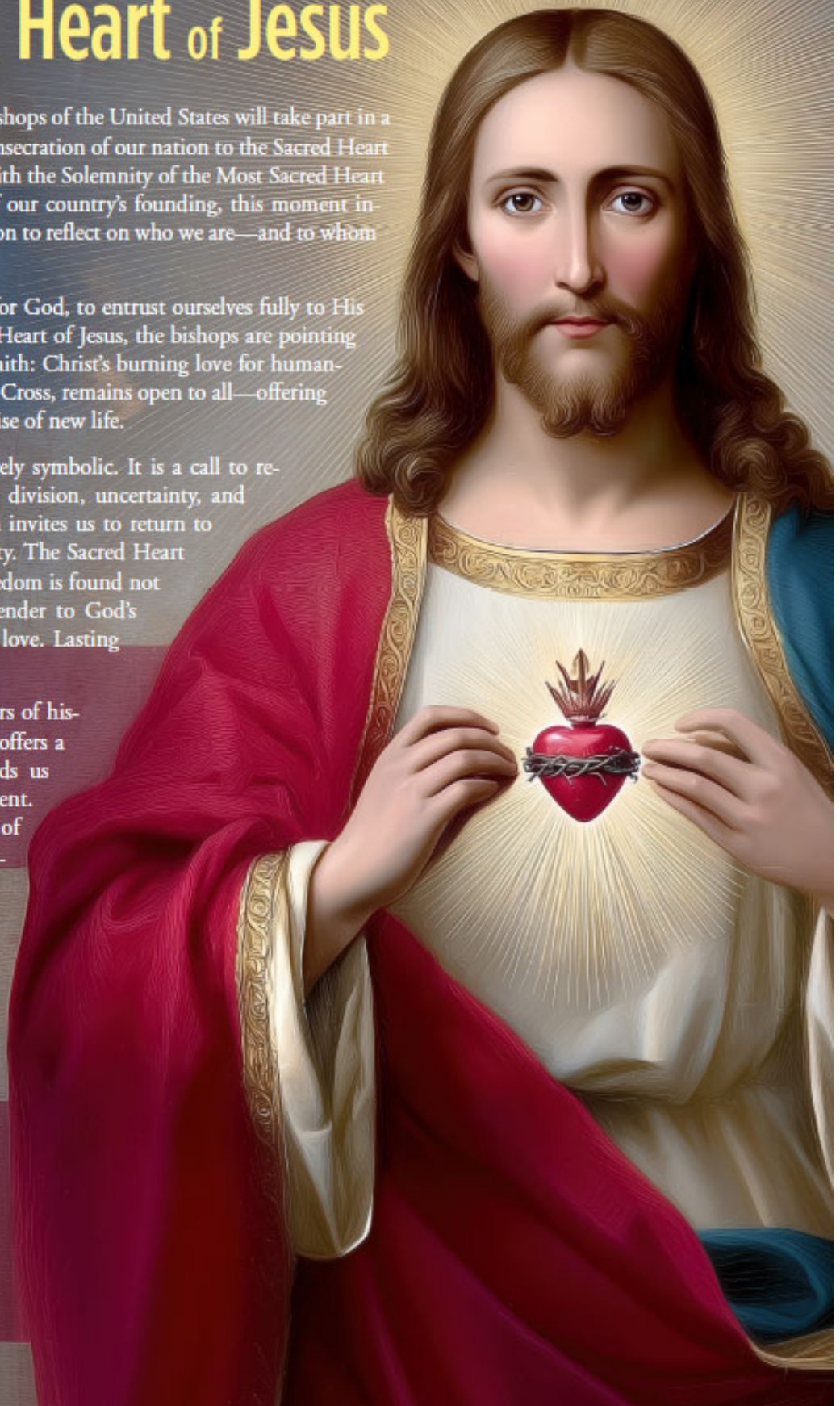
To consecrate is to set apart for God, to entrust ourselves fully to His care. In choosing the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the bishops are pointing us to the very center of our faith: Christ's burning love for humanity. His Heart, pierced on the Cross, remains open to all—offering mercy, healing, and the promise of new life.

This consecration is not merely symbolic. It is a call to renewal. In a time marked by division, uncertainty, and moral confusion, the Church invites us to return to the source of truth and charity. The Sacred Heart reminds us that authentic freedom is found not in self-assertion, but in surrender to God's will. True justice flows from love. Lasting peace begins in conversion.

As our nation marks 250 years of history, this act of consecration offers a deeper perspective. It reminds us that no nation is self-sufficient. We stand always in need of grace. By entrusting our country to Christ, we acknowledge Him as Lord of history and ask Him to guide our future.

Each of us has a role to play. The bishops are encouraging parishes and families to participate through prayer, acts of charity, and renewed devotion. This is an opportunity not only to pray for our nation, but to be transformed within it.

The Heart of Jesus is still open. The question is whether we will enter in.



WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO CONSECRATE A NATION?

Consecration is a sacred act by which a person, family, or community is entrusted to God in a special way. When the bishops consecrate the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, they are not making a political statement or changing civil structures. Rather, they are offering a prayer—placing our nation under the loving care and lordship of Christ.

This act reflects a long tradition in the Church. Individuals consecrate themselves to the Sacred Heart as a sign of trust in Jesus' mercy and a desire to live more fully for Him. Families enthrone the Sacred Heart in their homes. At times, even entire nations have been consecrated, asking for God's protection and guidance.

A national consecration is both a prayer and an invitation. It asks God to bless the country, but it also calls the faithful to deeper conversion. It is not a one-time event, but a beginning—a renewal of commitment to live according to the Gospel.

In this sense, the consecration of 2026 is not something done only by bishops. It is something the whole Church is invited to enter into with faith, humility, and trust.

O Most Sacred Heart of Jesus:

You know the longings of our hearts and call us into friendship with you. From your pierced side flows the wellspring of life for which we thirst, and your Heart burns with love for all people.

We thank you for the many gifts given to this nation, and we ask forgiveness for the offenses against you and against human dignity.

Unite our hearts to yours. Bring peace to our families and communities, reconcile what is broken, repair injustice, and heal the wounds of our land.

May your holy Catholic Church lead all people to your infinite love.

O Desire of Nations and Center of History, bless these United States of America.

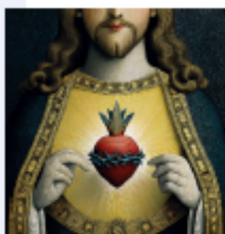

WHY THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS?

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most beloved devotions in the Church. It points to the mystery at the center of our faith: that God loves us with a human heart. Jesus' Heart, pierced on the Cross, reveals both the depth of His suffering and the boundless mercy He offers.

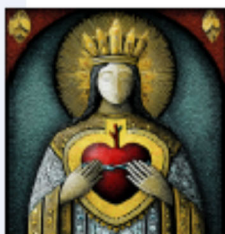
This devotion was given particular prominence through the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th century. In them, Christ revealed His desire that humanity turn to His Heart in trust, offering love in return for love.



The image of the Sacred Heart speaks powerfully to our time. It reminds us that God is not distant or indifferent. He is close, compassionate, and personally invested in our lives. His Heart burns with love for every person and every nation.



By consecrating the United States to the Sacred Heart, the bishops are inviting us to rediscover this devotion—not as something of the past, but as a living source of grace. It is an invitation to place our wounds, our hopes, and our future into the hands of Christ.



HOW CAN WE TAKE PART?

The consecration of the United States in June 2026 is meant to be a nationwide moment of prayer, but it begins in local parishes and individual hearts. The bishops are encouraging

Catholics everywhere to participate actively in this important event.

One way to prepare is through prayer. Many dioceses and parishes will offer a novena leading up to the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. Attending Mass, spending time in Eucharistic adoration, and praying to the Sacred Heart are all meaningful ways to enter into the consecration.

Families can take part by enthroneing an image of the Sacred Heart in their home, making Christ the center of family life. Acts of charity—especially toward the poor and those in need—also reflect the love of Christ's Heart.

Most importantly, the consecration is an invitation to personal conversion. Each of us is called to turn more fully to Christ, to trust in His mercy, and to live out His love in our daily lives.

In this way, the consecration becomes more than a single event. It becomes a lasting renewal of faith for our nation.

Parishioners' Corner

On the surface, there is little to suggest there would ever be a connection between Des Plaines based artist extraordinaire Amanda Vandervort and St. Elizabeth of the Trinity - our French Carmelite patron saint. Or, for that matter, a connection between Amanda Vandervort and our parish community. Nevertheless, through a chance intersection of paths, we are grateful and inspired to next weekend bless Amanda's rendition of our patroness in our church.

Amanda was born in Elgin and grew up in Tulsa, OK, which helps account for a southwestern influence in her work. From an early age, she was drawn to the world of artistry. She lauds her good teachers for developing her talents. Over the years she has worked in pen and ink, oils, acrylics, chalk, charcoal as well as sculpture and ceramics. Amanda's faith journey has, to some degree, mirrored her diverse artistic repertoire. She grew up in the Methodist Church, was confirmed as a Lutheran, attended Catholic schools, and was a member of an Episcopal Church.

It was, however, a recent impromptu meeting with a parishioner that led to a visit by Amanda to St. Elizabeth of the Trinity Church. She confides that she was struck by the welcoming and smiling faces she encountered. What's more, as a Cherokee woman, Amanda immediately noticed and admired our stained-glass window of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American saint canonized in the Catholic Church.

While Amanda's art focus has not been religious subjects, she embraced our request for a depiction of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity. She desired that our patroness would join St. Kateri in welcoming worshipers. Soon, Amanda dove into this project, striving to get beneath the surface of the photos available of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity to try to capture her spirit and her deep devotion to the Trinity. Then, Amanda went above the surface of a blank art canvas to produce - using the unique art form of her creation - the three-dimensional piece that will grace our church. As Amanda's completed piece confirms, her attention to detail is extraordinary.

Amanda is quick to give a nod to her husband, Steve, who as fire alarm technician, keeps her grounded with his logical approach to life. And Amanda extends a word of thanks to their 16-year-old daughter who provides her own set of youthful perspectives.

When not immersed in artistry, Amanda enjoys gardening, with the produce she grows going to a food pantry. Amanda confesses a love for many flavors of Ramen noodles.

Amanda is donating half the cost of the St. Elizabeth of the Trinity artwork as an in-kind donation. Parishioners Mike and Mary Shea are covering the balance of the cost, in honor of their Uncle Jim Shea, an artist, who in his circle of friends and family was known as "The Lord of the Dance."



ST. ELIZABETH OF THE TRINITY EPOXY STAINED GLASS SYMBOLISM

The French oak was used for construction during St. Elizabeth's lifetime. Staining it black evokes original sin. The surrounding by a rock doorway brings the rock of Christ as the doors to the Church.

Elizabeth's Carmelite habit brings in the earth, and the Carmelite symbol is a Trinity symbol. The red, white and blue are meant to symbolize the flags of both the U.S. and France. The Bible, the Carmelite symbol, and the sun's rays from the symbol are meant to show the Trinity again, as is the gold, silver and bronze leaf.

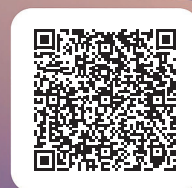

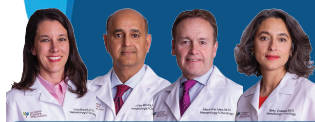

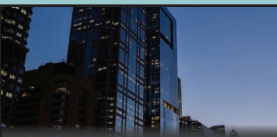
