FROM FR. DEO

August 30, 2026



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

God is good, all the time...All the time, God is good!

This Sunday's first reading from Jeremiah is one of my favorite passages because it captures the struggles of our relationship with God. Jeremiah does not hide his frustration, disappointment, and pain. He speaks openly to God, reminding us that faith is not always easy, and even those called by God can struggle, and feel like giving up. Have you ever had a "Jeremiah moment"—a time when you reached a breaking point and felt like giving up, perhaps even feeling "duped" by God? If so, you are not alone.

During my seminary internship in 2007, I was in charge of discipline, and one class gave me a very difficult time. They seemed to oppose everything I did, and I became so discouraged that I even questioned my vocation and considered leaving the priestly path. Then one morning, I found a note under my door from a student whom I had forgiven when he deserved to be sent home. It simply said, "Thank you for believing in me when I had given up on myself." That little note changed something in me. The problems did not disappear, but I remembered why I was there: not to seek success and control, but to love and believe in those kids who felt broken.

Jeremiah knew this struggle. Tired and discouraged, he wanted to stop speaking in God's name. He had faithfully proclaimed God's message, but he was faced with rejection and suffering instead. He even cried, "You duped me, O Lord." Yet he could not walk away, because God's word had become "like a fire burning in my heart."

In the Gospel, Peter wants a Messiah without suffering, glory without sacrifice, and victory without the Cross. But Jesus reminds him—and us—that discipleship is not always easy: "Whoever wishes to come after Me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me." We do not seek suffering; life brings enough crosses—illness, grief, disappointment, family struggles, and uncertainty. The question is not whether we will have crosses, but how we carry them. When we carry them with Christ, they find meaning, because we are not alone.

This speaks to anyone who has grown tired of living or serving—parents, family caregivers, healthcare workers, first responders, teachers, volunteers, priests, religious or anyone who has tried to do what is right and faced criticism instead. There will be moments when we say, "I can't do this anymore." Yet beneath our exhaustion, there may still be a small fire burning. That fire is God's grace which sustains us. We're called to be faithful to God, which means that even in our darkest moments, we do not allow that fire of God's Word and grace to go out. How do Jeremiah and the words of Christ speak to your life experience?

We are now preparing for our Parish Social on Saturday, September 19. Please mark your calendars and consider attending this wonderful event, which brings our parish community together. It will begin after the 4:00 p.m. Mass that day. Note that on Saturday, September 19 there will not be a 5:00 p.m. Mass.

Finally, please keep Fr. McCarthy and his sister in your prayers as they travel to Ireland from August 24 through September 8. May the Lord grant them safe travels and a blessed time with family and friends.

They should also be able to attend one meeting per month, typically on Monday evenings. In addition to monthly meetings, there is an expectation that members meet for 1-2 hours a month for PPC subcommittee work. PPC members serve in staggered terms from 1-3 years.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet



The name of the prayer sounded familiar. Yet it wasn't until my father introduced it to me after my mother passed in 2021, where I became accustomed to each line from Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska's diary entries and the few everyday prayers embedded throughout the chaplet. My dad informed me of her visions of Jesus and how she was canonized under Pope John Paul II. My dad recited the novena for his wife 56 years.

My visits to Metro Detroit to spend the weekend

with him increased. Or I would drive there for an evening and bring my dad to Chicago the following day for holidays and celebrations with my family. When he and I visited my mom at the cemetery, we would take out our rosaries and begin narrating the prayer from my phone. If it was biting cold, we would leave out the optional portions toward the end of the Divine Mercy or reduce the decades. Typically, by the second decade, my father would hesitate and get emotional. It seemed like moments of disbelief in requiring us to do this and that she was gone. At the end of January, 2022, my dad asked me to pray the novena of Divine Mercy once his time came. We were standing next to my mom's grave during this request. It is the only thing that I promised him.

When our family visited him a few months later, my dad introduced the prayer to them as well. At that point, he visited the cemetery each day, usually with daily Mass and perhaps a breakfast at his favorite bakery or diner. For the next few years, the only time I read the chaplet was with my dad and laden with intentions for my mom.

In 2024, my father was diagnosed with cancer. At first his treatment was going well. Yet by January, 2025, it had spread. By mid-March, he was bedridden. I asked the former pastor of St. Elizabeth of the Trinity, Father Mike Grisolano, if I had to recite the novena while physically being at my father's grave for nine days, once the funeral eventually commenced. He informed me at our men's group meeting that I could begin the prayer daily that evening. So I did. Seven days later my father passed. I continued recounting the Divine Mercy Chaplet each day, 300 miles away from my parents.

I noted the nine days but I didn't stop. From the chair near the front window of my home, I kept my mom's turquoise rosary to delve into Divine Mercy. It usually would occur late at night, after grades, lesson planning, emails, and paperwork were finished. Through October, I prayed for my dad. In November, since it is the month that my mom had passed, I began diverting the intentions onto her. In December, for both my parents. In 2026, I continued each day. I dedicated a quiet nine or ten minutes for my mother-in-law, friends of mine, and family members. As I continued this tradition, I couldn't help but think that this may be the first time Divine Mercy had been directed towards them, in order to solidify heaven. Each late family member and friend will receive a month of the chaplet. Once May, 2026 arrived, I began saying it for my dad once again. Next, my grandmothers. Then, grandfathers.

In November, it will be my mom's turn. When I whisper the prayer, the memories flood of my loved one. Sometimes, their death will as well. But I try to revert back to the wondrous memories with them as I chant each sentence, even their lives and efforts before I came into the picture.

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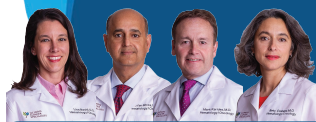
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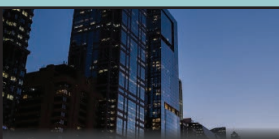
